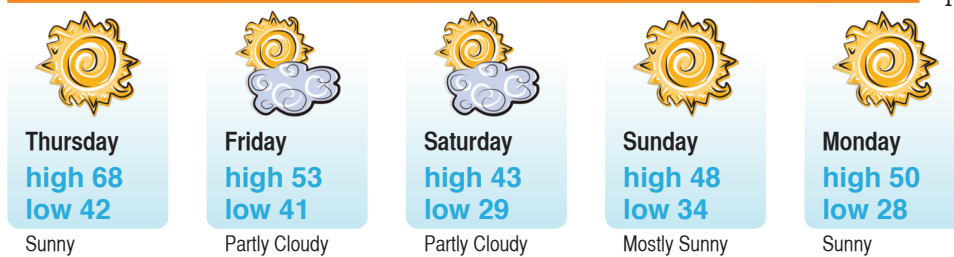

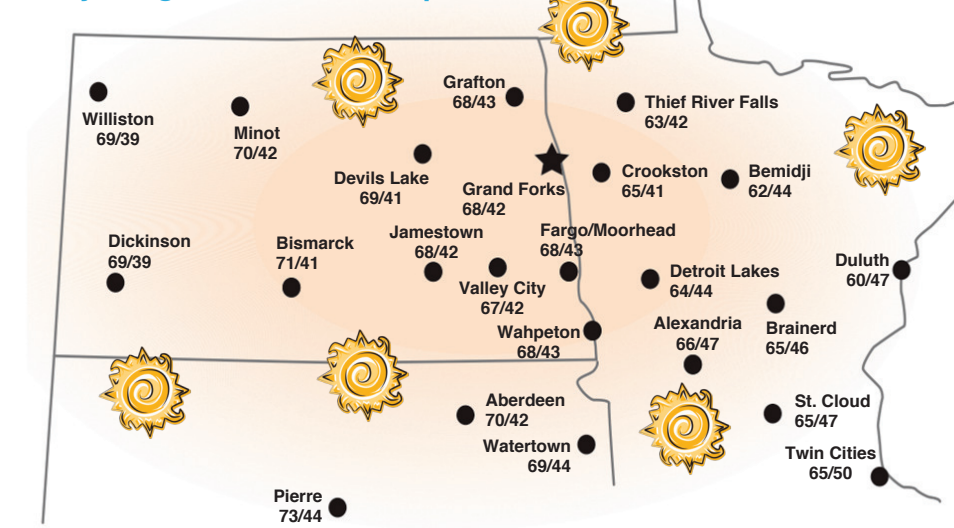

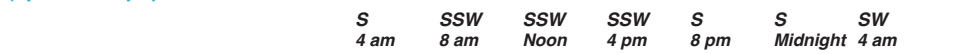

### Today's regional forecast map

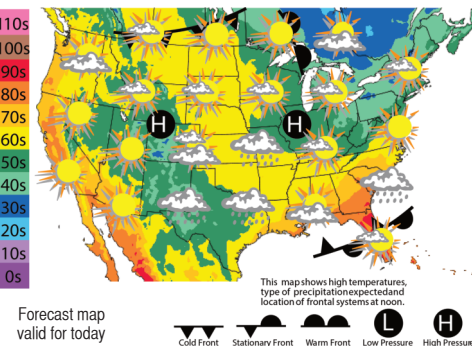


### 24-hour wind forecast (speed in mph)

### East Grand Forks will accept food shelf items instead of street maintenance fines

The East Grand Forks City Council voted Tuesday night to accept food shelf items instead of street maintenance fines until December.

This is the city's third year doing so. For the rest of the year, anyone who parks on the wrong side of the street during a maintenance period or snow emergency and gets a ticket can pay their fine with five non-expired food shelf items.

Street maintenance tickets typically cost \$15 the first time and increase the longer it takes for a ticket holder to pay, according to the Police Department.

### Grand Forks woman honored for her passion for preservation

A Grand Forks woman was honored Monday by the City Council for her decades of work dedicated to saving the town's history.

Marsha Gunderson was presented the Alexander Griggs Award on Monday night. She was one of the first members to join the Historic Preservation Commission in 1983 and said she'd helped create requirements for the award. It is named after the town's founder.

"I never thought I would be the one getting it someday," she said.

Gunderson volunteered on the commission for almost 30 years and served as chairperson for "a long, long time."

The council said Gunderson was instrumental in preserving history after the 1997 flood. She contacted state and national officials to find a way to save historic buildings Gunderson said she is proud of the town's post-flood recovery. She remembers walking through the streets to survey the damage before it was declared safe for the public, and said she cried as she saw the town's history threatened by the high

waters.

"We almost lost a lot of downtown, but there was just too much history there to let it go," she said.

Gunderson left the commission in 2015 because she said it was time for new people to get involved. She said the commission still calls her for input, and she feels honored to receive the award for her work there.

"Historic preservation is just something I think needs to be done," she said. "I think it's that way with everybody. Everyone has a passion for some kind of historic preservation - be it buildings or family histories. That's my passion, knowing the past."

Gunderson also was the marketing manager at the Grand Forks Herald. She retired in 2016 after 42 years at the paper.

### Teen on four-wheeler hits car in Pembina County

ST. THOMAS, N.D. - A St. Thomas teenager was injured Tuesday afternoon in Pembina County after striking a car with an all-terrain vehicle, according to the North Dakota Highway Patrol.

The 17-year-old, whose name was not released by the law enforcement agency, was driving a 1992 Yamaha four-wheeler south on 151st Street Northeast about 3 miles east of St. Thomas when he failed to yield to a 2003 Honda Accord, which was eastbound on County Road 11, state troopers said in a news release. The four-wheeler hit the left rear corner of the Honda before entering the south ditch and tipping onto its side, the release said.

The 27-year-old driver of the Honda, Jacob Corbit of Big Sky, Mont., was not injured, but the teen was taken to a hospital with injuries that weren't life-threatening, state troopers said.

The juvenile could face charges of failure to yield and off-highway vehicle violations, the release said.

St. Thomas is about 60 miles northwest of Grand Forks.
