iPad. "One we've used is Seeing AI, a talking camera app," noted Kathleen. "This app can tell the owner how many people are in the room, can scan and read documents and can also read product codes."

A few other include: JAWS, Job Access With Speech (This is a screen reader used on a computer. It basically serves the same function as Voiceover on an iPad); Perkins Brailler (this standard braille writer is Brynn's preferred braille output device); and a Mountbatten Brailler (An electronic braille writer. This device has speech output, braille erasing capabilities, can store braille files as well as connect to other devices via Bluetooth).

Not to mention the various tactile graphics, displays and tools. This includes but is not limited to tactile graphs, maps, globes, and rulers. Brynn needs to have tactile or braille access to any materials presented in print to her peers.

When it comes to textbooks needed in the classroom, they are often produced off-site and Braille books are also ordered through the Minnesota Braille and Talking Book Library.

Books can also be downloaded at school from special websites. They are then translated into braille using the program Duxbury, and printed in braille using an embosser. This process is also used for many of the classroom worksheets. The worksheets are downloaded or scanned into the computer, formatted and embossed. Oftentimes the worksheets are typed in manually by Pam who will also create many of the needed tactile graphics herself.

The final piece that is used for Brynn's learning is the Picture in a Flash (PIAF) machine: Shapes or graphics printed on paper are copied onto a special paper and then put through the PIAF machine. The graphic comes out with raised lines after going through the machine.

Gifted speaker and singer

As it turns out, Brynn is not shy and she is sharing her successes with others. Brynn recently visited Churchill Elementary in Cloquet for the second time to share her story with 2nd graders who were studying a Helen Keller unit.

Brynn has spoken to seven classrooms now. Four classes in Floodwood, two in Cloquet and Mrs. Clark's 2nd grade in McGregor. "She really is a gifted speaker," added Kathleen. "She does a great job of answering questions and doesn't get rattled."

Brynn recalls her first presentation with the 2nd grade students at Churchill Elementary in Cloquet. "My first time was last year," recalls Brynn. "I was a little nervous at first, but then I thought it's just about me, so why am I so nervous?"

When not speaking to classes, Brynn can also be found singing the National Anthem at ballgames. "It started out as a surprise for my mom. My dad and I were planning it. We wanted to do something exciting. My mom was very surprised and couldn't believe what was going on."

Brynn had a busy day on Thursday. After visiting Churchill Elementary, she sang at the boys basketball contest Floodwood versus Isle.

Brynn is on a fast track to success and she admits that her favorite classes are library, art and music. "I love to learn music and reading," she added. "I also love arts and crafts."

Looking to the future, Brynn concluded that she would like to be a horseback riding instructor and an author.

Kathleen's first year observation is a positive one for Brynn and Floodwood School. "The team here has really done a tremendous job. It really does take a village and the entire school has worked together to get her to where she is now, which is wonderful."
