Father, son roll 300s on same night

Rolling a perfect, 300 game isn't easy.

It's an accomplishment for the most well-seasoned bowler.

And when a father and son roll 300 games on the same night, it's one for the memory books.

Brian Henze of Montgomery and his son, Tyler, both bowled perfect games Thursday night, October 25.

"We both got 300s and were 300 miles apart," Brian shared. "It's pretty special."

Brian was subbing for a friend at Pla Mor Lanes in Montgomery.

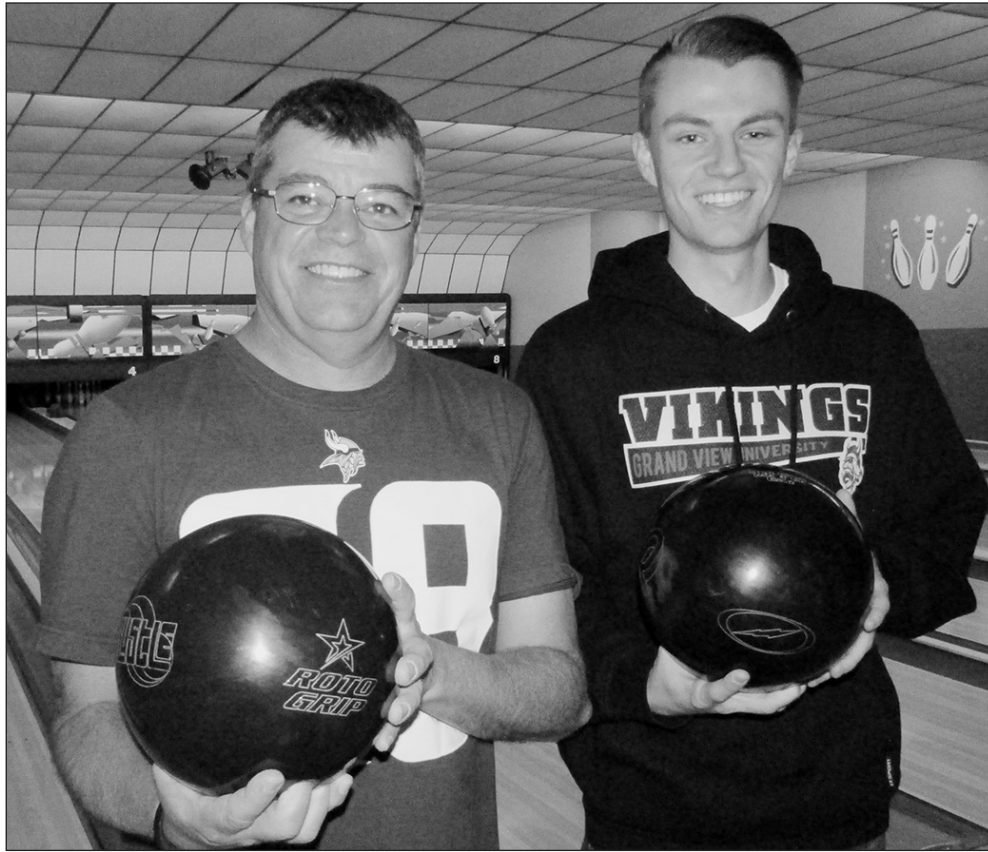
Tyler, a 2017 Tri-City United graduate, was subbing for a friend at Bowlerama in Des Moines, Iowa.

The younger Henze's 300 came first.

"The possibility of getting a 300 didn't cross my mind until the ninth frame," explained Tyler, who bowls for Grand View University and averages 220. "I was bowling with my friend, Tyler Cardar, and we just kept talking about other stuff—our physics homework and other stuff—because if you start thinking about it a lot, you start getting more nervous."

But, the strikes kept coming, and Tyler logged his first, sanctioned 300 game.

"I've had a 300 in practice or while I'm bowling on my own before, but this was my first official 300 from ABC (American Bowling Congress)," he explained. "It was

exciting, but you just keep bowling."

Tyler rolled the 300 in his first game of the series, and followed it with scores of 223 and 156.

"I was getting really tired," Tyler admitted. "I had already (bowling) practiced for two hours after class, studied for an hour and a half, and was bowling again... It was a long day."

Before returning to his studies that night, Tyler texted his parents to inform them of his perfect game. But, only

his mom, Lori, received the message.

"I left my phone at home that night, and didn't find out until after I got home—after bowling my own 300," explained Brian, who bowls Monday nights in New Prague and subs in Montgomery on Thursday nights, averaging 218.

Brian, who was bowling with Wade Hintz of Montgomery that evening, threw a 300 game to start the series, following it with games of 234 and 203.

"I haven't had one for close to 20 years," laughed Brian. "It felt great."

The 300 was actually the eleventh perfect score he's rolled in his lifetime. He also has five 800 series under his belt, too.

"It never gets old," he chuckled.

Had he had his phone on him, Brian would have shared his good news with his son and the rest of his family, but that's not how it worked out.
