Brooklyn Center babysitter was sentenced

to more than 21 years in prison July 22 for killing longer," a 9-month-old Blaine boy who was left in her care.

On June 21 Jennifer Lynn Baldwin, 38, was little boy, always smiling, found guilty in Hennepin and I don't understand County District Court in Minneapolis of second degree murder while committing assault in the third degree of a victim under the age of 4.

Baldwin was sentenced July 22 to a prison term of 255 months (21 years, 3 months), and was credited 36 days she'd already served in jail.

"I wished it had been said Caitlin O'Brien, the mother of the victim, Colton Senogles. "(Colton) was the nicest why anyone would want to hurt him, or any child at all.'

According to the criminal complaint, the incident that resulted in Colton's death occurred on March 15, 2018.

On that date, police and paramedics arrived at Baldwin's residence on a report of an infant in

that Colton was lethargic and appeared to be laboring to breathe.

The baby was transported by ambulance to a hospital and treated for head injuries. Colton died five days later, on March 20, 2018.

O'Brien told investigators that she had taken her son to Baldwin's home at approximately 10:30 a.m. and Colton appeared uninjured and physically fine.

O'Brien had been friends with Baldwin several years.

At 11:39 a.m., Baldwin called O'Brien to come get Colton because "some-thing's not right." O'Brien advised Baldwin to call 911. Baldwin then called Colton's father, Logan Senogles, who also advised her to call 911. She called 911 at 11:46 a.m.

Baldwin initially told investigators that she had laid Colton down to sleep, and after approximately a half an hour, he woke up and was "fussing." She went to get a dry outfit for him, and when Baldwin laid Colton down on the floor to change him, "she noticed his eyes 'would roll back' and he looked like 'he was in a different world,"" the complaint reads.

An autopsy performed by the Hennepin County Medical Examiner's office found evidence of blunt

A dozen people also showed up in support of Baldwin, many of whom testified in support of her during the trial.

Baldwin did not testify at her trial but did submit a letter to the judge for the sentencing. The letter was not read in court.

"Miss Baldwin is remorseful about this," said Baldwin's attorney Andrew Gordan, paraphras-ing her letter. "She's not remorseful because she has been charged with a crime that she has been convicted of, but she's remorseful because Colton is dead. She knows and understands that Colton's family will be missing all of the little things that are going to be denied to them.

Baldwin cried quietly throughout the sentencing hearing, and never looked into the gallery or at O'Brien and Senogles.

"Miss Baldwin, it's tragic that your children will grow up without a mother, but you've been found guilty of murder, and that changes everything," Hennepin County District Court Judge Jamie Anderson said during the sentencing. "I wish we knew exactly what happened that day."
