Ogilvie STEAM program expands Monday education options

Ogilvie Public Schools are offering something different this year to encourage student learning in STEAM subjects while offering working parents an alternative to Monday-only daycare.

Ogilvie schools operate a

4-day school week with most Mondays off. For parents who work on Mondays, they may need to find childcare for those days. Now, Ogilvie Community Education is offering special STEAM education on those non-school days.

STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. The learn-

ing focus is on those subjects, as well as reading and personal wellness.

In June, Kelsey Kehoe took on the role of Ogilvie community education director. Her plan is to revamp the program to be more accessible for students and working parents.

During previous school years STEAM has been offered

one Monday per month from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Now, it will be every Monday school isn't in session during regular school hours which are from 7:40 a.m. to 3:40 p.m.

In addition, Lion Cub Care is offered Monday through Friday from 6:30-7:40am and 3:40-6 p.m. so parents can, if needed, drop off their kids

before school and pick them up after school hours. For a fee, the LCC program gives students ages 3-12 the opportunity to choose from a variety of activities, including arts and crafts, puzzles, games and movies. Quiet areas are also available for homework and

Car collides with multiple motorcycles

1 dead, 6 injured

A South Dakota man has died and others seriously injured after a crash Saturday, Aug. 17, at the intersection of Highway 70 and Mahogany Street in Brunswick.

According to the Minnesota State Patrol, at approximately 8:30 a.m. a Toyota Camry was traveling north on Mahogany Street when they failed to yield at the intersection of Hwy. 70; the car struck two Harley Davidson motorcycles and caused a Victory motorcycle to run off of the road. Each Harley was carrying a driver and a passenger.

Jerrad J. Quenomoen, 42, of Java, South Dakota died at the scene. Three medical helicopters arrived at the scene to airlift the injured. Others were taken by ambulance. According to the Minnesota State Patrol, none of the motorcyclists were wearing helmets.

The Kanabec County Sheriff's Office and State Patrol responded to the scene; State patrol is conducting an investigation into the crash.
