The cast and crew was scheduled to complete their preliminary round for Section 4AA of the competition at Stillwater High School Jan. 24, after the Blaine/Spring Lake Park Life went to press.

The annual Minnesota State One-Act Competition is where 315 high schools, making up 311 teams, compete by performing a oneact play that is no more than 35 minutes long.

"The one-act allows us to have more concentrated effort on each moment of the show," said Spring Lake Park theater director Kevin Dutcher. "As it is so short, we are able to pay more attention to detail. Every moment is worked through because of the length of the show, and this challenges and places more responsibility on the actors."
