

### **NWSC girls cross-country** 4 Blaine girls, SLP duo earn All-NWSC

Blaine had four runners secure all-conference honors at the Northwest Suburban Conference Championships in Elk River Oct. 10, fueling a fourth-place finish out of 14 teams.

Spring Lake Park had a pair of all-conference runners pace a ninth-place team finish.

Blaine freshman Kelsey Huver led the way for the Bengals in 15th individually in 20:15.3, with eighth-grader Shalom Sulungaine just behind in 17th in 20:25.0. Senior Stephanie Lewis earned 26th in 20:49.9 and sophomore Isabelle Scully took 27th in 20:51.5 to earn all-NWSC honors as well.

Brianna Bergerson finished in 43rd place in 21:40.0 to round out the scoring for Blaine, with Adriana Potts finishing 68th in 22:23.6, Bailey Heller finishing 73rd in 22:39.1 and Jordyn Lang finishing

Spring Lake Park freshman Kaitlyn Finnegan cruised to 10th overall in 20:01.8 and junior Jenna Terrio finished 20th in 20:34.6 to both earn all-conference distinction and lead the Panthers.

Autumn VanDenTop followed in 47th place in 21:43.3 and Claire VanDenTop took 61st in 22:12.8.

Andover ran away with the team championship with 25 points, followed by Maple Grove (113), Osseo (125), Blaine (127), Centennial (152), Elk River (167), Champlin Park (217), Anoka (219), Spring Lake Park (221), Irondale (253), Robbinsdale Armstrong (256), Coon Rapids (322), Totino-Grace (351) and Park Center (357).
