

# BHS boys take 3rd, girls 4th at home meet

**BEMIDJI** — The Bemidji High School boys and girls cross country teams braved the cold for their lone home meet of the season Tuesday afternoon at Greenwood Golf Course.

The BHS boys finished third with 71 points, and the Lumberjack girls placed fourth with 127 points in the Bemidji Invitational.

Perham took home team titles in both the boys and girls divisions with 44 and 43 points, respectively.

Moorhead's Zach Johnson won the boys individual title with his time of 16:17, and Crookston's Katherine Geist claimed the girls title with her time of 19:34.5, more than 22

seconds faster than the runner-up.

"A meet got cancelled on Monday and we had five teams add just yesterday to the meet, so it's the largest we've ever had at 14 teams," said BHS head coach Ryan Aylesworth. "And it was very high quality runners that were here today. I was very happy with how they performed. I think it was a nice tune-up going into the section meet next week."

Riley Berg and Regan DeWitt posted the fastest times for the Bemidji boys and girls teams, respectively. Berg finished eighth with his time of 17:08.5, and DeWitt took seventh with her time of 20:15.6.

A pair of Yousos also cracked the top 10 in both races. Gwen and Nicholas Youso each placed 10th in the girls (20:23)

and boys (17:12.4) races, respectively.

Runners dealt with chilly temperatures that dipped into the mid-30s.

"It was alright. I just had to keep the sweats on as long as possible," Berg said. "But it wasn't too bad once we got moving in the race."

"You just wear whatever you can to stay warm," DeWitt added, "because if you get too cold you go numb. You just can't race as well and your legs freeze up."

The Lumberjacks are used to hosting their home meet on the rolling hills of the golf course east of Bemidji. Bemidji runners enjoyed having more of a home crowd than usual.

"It's nice to have some

## Lumberjack boys edge Cathedral in physical battle

The Crusaders didn't make it easy, but the North No.1 seeded Bemidji High School boys soccer team battled through a physical Section 8A semifinal game en route to a 4-2 win over South No. 2 St. Cloud Cathedral on Tuesday at Chet Anderson Stadium.

"They knew that in order to beat us, they were going to have to be very aggressive," BHS head coach Rick Toward said. "They were going to have to put high pressure on us, and sometimes high pressure sometimes means collisions that you intend or don't intend. There was definitely a desire to play the body instead of the ball, but in the end, my boys did enough to find the net four times and get the victory."

The Crusaders (15-4) never led in the match, but the first two times Bemidji took the lead, they found a way to answer.

Bemidji (16-2-1) opened the scoring in the fifth minute when Aidan Helwig made a nice play to feed James Siems for a 1-0 lead.

"Pau (Meseguer) put a ball in the box and I just headed it over to James, and James tapped it in," said Helwig.

Cathedral tied the game at 1-all with four minutes left in the half when Bemidji failed to clear a corner kick, resulting in a Cole Tatrault goal from Jackson Kent.

Three minutes into the second half, the Jacks regained the lead on a blasted strike from Aspen Galdamez, again assisted by Helwig.

The Crusaders answered again, though, in the 62nd minute on an impressive goal from McRay Drong, with an assist going to Joshua Revier.

Both SCC scorers were the attackers Toward was conscious of going into the game, but overall, he said he was happy with how the team handled them.

"The two goals we allowed, we were in position," he said. "We just missed clears and wound up giving the ball basically to them at the top of the 18. JD's helpless in that situation, they just have to place the ball in the corner, and they're good finishers."

"To play this team twice and give up two goals total to them, I'll take it."

Three minutes after Bemidji brought Ben Hess into the game despite an injury, Hess assisted the eventual game winning goal by Ethan Mock in the 72nd minute, and Mock then assisted Logan Mitchell when Mitchell sealed the 4-2 Lumberjacks victory with 2:02 left to play.

"We get up, 1-0, they tie us. We get up, 2-1, they tie us," Toward said. "We come back, 3-2, and instead of saying, 'OK, we're good,' we put the nail in the coffin with that fourth goal. Well played. I'm super proud of the maturity

## Bemidji girls shut out Crusaders

The Bemidji High School girls soccer team went into Tuesday's Section 8A semifinal game looking for a shutout, and, after two set piece goals and an insurance tally late, they achieved the feat with a 3-0 win over St. Cloud Cathedral to advance to the section final.

"One of the goals we set was a shutout," BHS head coach Logan Larsen said. "A win's a win, but a shutout was one thing we were aiming for, especially with changing formations up a little bit, so I was happy we got that."

Noticing the Lumberjacks (13-4-2) had the lowest goals against average in the section while allowing several set piece goals this year, Larsen decided the back line could handle the workload with three and moved the fourth spot up to forward for some extra attacking power.

"We took one player and moved her up so we had more presence in the center of the field and more variation in the attack so we'd get more goals," Larsen said.

While it didn't directly result in scoring, the Lumberjacks pressured the Crusaders throughout the game and, in the 19th minute, the pressure earned them a Harper Toward free kick 30 yards from goal.

"During warmups, I was shooting those same shots on Alli to get her ready for them," Toward said. "I

didn't really expect that I would have to take them for myself. I just set the ball there and took a second, composed myself and it the shot and I was just really hoping it dropped and it did."

The goal gave Bemidji all it would need, but Toward's fellow senior captain Alyse Stone took her turn at a set piece in the 69th minute and had the same result, tucking her shot into the low left corner of the net.

Three minutes later, Liberty Dickerson capped the scoring with a rebound goal, assisted by Lindsey Hildenbrand, to make it 3-0.

"It took a little bit of time, but after that I think we really started creating more opportunities and getting more shots on goal," said Toward.

The Lumberjacks heavily outchanced the Crusaders (10-6-2) in the game, hitting two cross bars and having several other quality shots on goal.

With the win, Bemidji advances to face Sartell-St. Stephen (11-5-2) in the Section 8A final on Thursday, Oct. 18. Exact time and place have yet to be determined.

"I'm going to be learning everything I can about them from here until then," Larsen said, "but once again, it'll just be heart and effort."

The Lumberjacks beat the Sabres 1-0 in the section semifinals a year ago, but haven't played them this season.

"This year it's just going to take a lot of heart," Toward said. "If

# BSU rises to No. 3 in national rankings

**BEMIDJI** — The Bemidji State soccer team has risen up the national rankings again. The unbeaten Beavers came in at No. 3 in this week's United Soccer Coaches poll, their highest ranking in program history.

BSU improved to 14-0-0 overall and 11-0-0 in Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference play with a 3-2, double-overtime win Sunday over then No. 22 Minnesota State. Freshman Sara Wendt scored the game-winning goal in the 105th minute of

the back-and-forth contest.

The Oct. 16 poll is the Beavers' sixth appearance in the national poll this season, and the 11th time in school history following a five-week run in the top 25 to end the 2017 regular season. This week's ranking surpasses the previous program-best ranking for the fourth consecutive week, rising from No. 5 in last week's poll.

Minnesota State (10-2-1, 9-1-1 NSIC) is the only other NSIC team in the rankings, dropping one spot to No. 23.

BSU remains at No. 1 in the Central Region Poll for the sec-

ond straight time after wins over Concordia-St. Paul and MSU. The NCAA will announce its first regional poll Wednesday. At the conclusion of the season, the top eight teams from each region advance to the regional tournament, which is hosted by the two highest remaining seeds, Nov. 9 and 11.

The Beavers will be on the road this weekend for a pair of matches. They'll face Wayne State at 3 p.m. Friday, Oct. 19, before meeting Augustana in a rematch of last season's NCAA first-round overtime loss on Sunday, Oct. 21 at 1 p.m.

### Men's hockey receives votes in USCHO poll

**BEMIDJI** — The Bemidji State men's hockey team garnered votes in this week's USCHO.com poll after its series win with North Dakota over the weekend.

The Beavers received 31 votes in Monday's poll that followed a 2-1 win Friday in Bemidji, and a 1-1 tie Saturday in Grand Forks, N.D. The Fighting Hawks dropped three spots from No. 13 to No. 16 after scoring just two goals in the season-opening series.

The Western Collegiate Hock-

ey Association also landed its first team in the USCHO top 10 this season on Monday. Minnesota State climbed to No. 7 from No. 11 after the Mavericks swept Boston University in Mankato.

Bowling Green is the only other WCHA school in the top 20, coming in at No. 17 after a series split with Robert Morris. Northern Michigan (34) and Michigan Tech (8) also received votes.

Bemidji State has this weekend off, and will return to action Oct. 26-27 for its first WCHA series of the season at Northern Michigan.

# Jacks look to hit playoffs on high note

BEMIDJI — The Bemidji High School football team has just one blemish on the schedule so far, and they hope to keep it that way going into the Section 8-5A tournament.

To do that, the Lumberjacks will have to get through their week eight opponent, St. Cloud Tech (5-2). Kickoff between the two teams is set for 7 p.m. tonight at Husky Stadium on the campus of St. Cloud State.

The Lumberjacks (6-1), have only lost to Sauk

Rapids-Rice this season, that coming in a game that was cut short 5 minutes, 16 seconds due to lightning. Down 38-37, the Lumberjacks drove the ball to a first down on their own 46 yard line when the game went into delay and never continued. The Tigers started the

season with five straight wins before falling to Sauk Rapids and Princeton the past two weeks.

The losses were largely due to the team missing several offensive and defensive starters who were cited for underage drinking at a house party, according to the St. Cloud

Times, and were therefore suspended for two games. The suspended players are eligible to return for today's contest.

Regardless of the result of tonight's game, Bemidji is expected to receive the top seed in the Section 8-5A tournament due to its superior QRF ranking,

which is how seeding is determined. In that case, the Jacks will host their semifinal game Saturday, Oct. 27, against the winner between the fourth and fifth seeds, who will play Tuesday, Oct. 23.

Section seedings will be released Thursday, Oct. 18.
