We are certainly living in a time of great need. Our greatest need, though, is the Good Friday crucifixion of Jesus and the wonderful message of Resurrection Sunday. In fact, look at the priority the Apostle Paul gives it in 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 15:3-5:

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.

It is Christ's Death and Resurrection that we remember and celebrate this weekend. But there is another death and resurrection that matters. You see, Christ's death in our place also put the Old Testament law to death. Following rules, actually, was never God's basis for acceptance. See Galatians 2:19,20:

For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

If you've placed your faith in Jesus, admitting you have sinned, and that He died for your sins, then you have died to yourself ("It is no longer I who live"). Your new life is lived "by faith in the Son of God." Your new life "in Christ . . . is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. (2 Corinthians 5:17)

But that's not all! Not only are we able to live a new life by faith in Jesus NOW, but His Easter Sunday Resurrection from the dead some 2000 years ago seals a promise of our own bodily resurrection. I Corinthians 15:17,21 summarizes it like this:

And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. . . But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Jesus is the first of many that will rise from the dead. Put your trust in Him today for your own death and resurrection.

#### Reading: Matthew 28:1-10

Fear - it's one of the most powerful and crippling emotions we have.

When you're locked in fear's grip, it's a very real and powerful thing. It can be overwhelming. There are fears of known things we face in the world. And then there is fear of the unknown. What does the future hold? What is the doctor going to tell me? What will life be like without my loved one? Am I going to suffer? How am I going to die?

How about fear of a virus? An invisible enemy that is wreaking havoc in our lives.

That's a lot of fear to deal with. How are you going to deal with it? One way is to ignore it - just pretend it doesn't exist, and that might work for a while. But ignoring it never works for long, although it seems to be the most popular method.

although it seems to be the most popular method. There is another way. And that is what we celebrate this Easter. For it is not to ignore our fears - but to know and trust and rejoice

that we have a God and Savior who has dealt with everything that causes us to fear. He has come and conquered everything that is against us.

And so He comes this day. Triumphant from the grave. Triumphant over death, over our sins, and over Satan.

And He has a very simple message for us – spoken first by the

And He has a very simple message for us — spoken first by the angel, and then by Jesus Himself. The message of what Easter is all about. "Do not be afraid."

He is the One who confronted whatever it is that is causing your fear and defeated it. There is no sin, no enemy, no trouble, no disease - there is <u>nothing</u> in all creation that escaped His victory. Christ has risen.

Easter changes everything. So when He says to us today: "Do not be afraid" — those are not

mere words, but words that do what they say. Words filled with forgiveness, with victory, with hope, and not just for a life after this one - but for our lives already here and now.

It's true - there are times in our lives when it looks as if even

God's not in control. And we get afraid and confused. Things don't seem so clear. It happens to all of us - just ask the ladies who went to the tomb that Easter morning.

But today we point to the empty tomb - to our risen Lord, and

confess "I know that my Redeemer lives! And I have nothing to fear" And that is the confidence that we have because of Easter. So no matter what you are facing in your life - whatever challenges, whatever fears, whatever doubts, whatever enemies..."Do not be afraid."

Your Savior has triumphed, and He comes to you, triumphing still, with His precious Words of the Gospel. He comes to you with His precious Body and Blood in His Supper. He speaks words of forgiveness into your very ears in His Absolution. It's true. All of it. For you.

He comes to you forgiving your sin — giving and strengthening your faith — and providing all you need, and saying to you..."Do not be afraid."

For Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
