#### **ALP Utilities is** flushing hydrants

Attention ALP Utilities water customers: ALP will be flushing fire hydrants between 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. over the course of the next eight weeks, starting April 20.

Fire hydrants are woodtick flushed to remove mineral deposits and sedimains and to ensure proper operation for May 2. fire protection.

During flushing operations, it is not unusual for customers to experience discoloration in the water, and or pressure changes.
