

A final reminder is sent those who have remained unresponsive - the last reminder before census workers start knocking on doors.

From the end of April through August, licensed census workers, who will have a valid form of identification issued by the state, will go door-to-door for the remaining households. A census taker will follow-up with a household six times - three times by mail and three times by door knocks.
