# **PROTESTS SPREAD NORTH**

# Anoka sees peaceful gathering June 1

crowd gathered А peacefully on Main Street in downtown Anoka Monday, June 1, to protest the death of George Floyd in police custody.

Assembling next to City Hall near the Rum River bridge, protesters held signs and chanted phrases such as "No justice, no peace," "I can't breathe," and "Prosecute the police." There were also calland-response chants with George Floyd's name.

"Anoka doesn't want to hear none of this, so I really think we should make them hear it," Jalviah Taylor, one of the leaders of the protest, shouted to the crowd. Taylor grew up in Anoka and now lives in Coon Rapids. "I'm so tired of feeling (expletive) unsafe in Anoka. Anoka High School tormented me.

Many motorists honked in support as they drove by the group, which swelled to more than 100 people, but a few shouted angrily at protesters. Organizers called for a peaceful protest and asked those in attendance to wear masks, which some did, to minimize the risk of spreading the novel coronavirus. The protest took place despite a last-minute cancellation notice online by Hannah Helmer, one of the original organizers, citing a desire for more time to plan in order to

# Northtown Mall hit with minor damage, looting May 28

Unrest spread to Anoka County the evening of May 28 as looters targeted Northtown Mall in Blaine, while riots and property damage continued across the Twin Cities after the May 25 death of George Floyd in Minneapolis police custody.

According to Capt. Mark Boerboom of the Blaine Police Department, the May 28 incident was isolated to Northtown, where there was "minimal damage to the building.'
