BA controls the line of scrimmage at KW

KENYON — Bethlehem Academy brought a 1-3 record into Friday night's game against the 2-2 Kenyon-Wanamingo Knights. The Cardinals played way better than their record indicated in a 42-0 shutout over KW.

The larger BA line dominated the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball, rolling up 359 yards of offense, while holding Kenyon-Wanamingo to just 87 total yards.

The Knights were playing without their leading rusher, Tyler Craig. Craig injured his foot while playing in a Homecoming volleyball game on Thursday. His status for Friday's game with Blooming Prairie is unknown at this time.

The Cards scored in every quarter. Josh Oathoudt scored on runs of one, two, and 10 yards. Jack Jandro and Charlie King hooked up on scoring passes of five and 25 yards. Justin Simons scored on a two-yard run to end scoring in the fourth quarter.

Luke Berg was 2 of 4 passing for -4 yards for the Knights. Josh Johnson was a bright spot for the Knights. He came off the bench to rush the ball six times for a team-high 64 yards.. Bray Olson and Tate Erlandson each had a reception.

The Knights (2-3) will play at undefeated and third-ranked Class A Blooming Prairie on Friday. The Awesome Blossoms are coming off a 62-15 win over previously unbeaten Randolph. Kickoff is 7 p.m.

PI rolls up over 500 yards

PINE ISLAND — It was a very good night for the Pine Island football team. The Panthers rolled up over 500 yards of offense in their first win of the season, a 47-23 victory over Dover-Eyota in Pine Island, Friday.

After a scoreless first quarter, PI scored twice. Carter O'Reilly hit Max Owen with a 23-yard pass, and O'Reilly plunged in from the one. Dylan Holzer kicked the first of six PATs. But the Eagles rallied late in the half, scoring on a one-yard run by Blake Blattner with 13 seconds left before the break for a 14-7 score.

The Panthers came back from the break to score two more touchdowns in the third quarter. Jarod White broke away for a 68-yard touchdown run and, after recovering a DE fumble, Pine Island scored on a 32-yard pass from O'Reilly to White.

The PI defense stopped the Eagles again, turning their next drive into six points on a one-yard run by Owen Allen just two minutes into the fourth quarter.

DE scored on a five-yard run by Blattner, but White ran in from the 30 to push PI's lead to 41-15. The Eagles scored on a 17-yard pass from Greg Holst

to Landen Klassen with 1:56 to play, but Pine Island was able to score one more time on an 18-yard run by Sam Johnson with eight seconds to play in the game.

Carter O'Reilly was 9 of 22 passing for 119 yards, two touchdowns and one interception for PI. Jarod White rushed for 195 yards on 18 carries. Max Owen made four receptions for 42 yards, and he led the defense for the third week in a row with eight tackles.

The Panthers will host Triton on Friday in their Homecoming game at 7 p.m. The Cobras are 3-2 overall, coming off a 22-19 loss to St. Charles.

Goodhue D gets tough when needed

GOODHUE — After losing their last two games, the Goodhue football team rebounded with a 14-7 win at Medford on Friday. The Wildcat defense stood tall when they needed to.

After a scoreless first quarter, Medford got on the scoreboard midway through the second quarter on a three-yard run by Jerone Chavez. Jacob Andrews kicked the PAT.

The Cats used a long drive, scoring with 19 seconds left in the half on a nine-yard TD pass from Sam Opsahl to Conor O'Reilly.

The Tigers looked to take the lead near the end of the third quarter, but the Goodhue defense made a big stand, stopping Medford on second and goal from the one. The Cats pushed the Tigers back to fourth and goal on the seven, and then came up with the defensive stop with 3:21 to play in the quarter.

The Goodhue offense went on an 18-play, 93-yard drive, scoring on a 17-yard run by Logan Ferguson. Opsahl hit Kyle Schoenfelder with the conversion pass for a 14-7 lead with 6:03 to play.

Medford tried to rally again, reaching the Goodhue 18-yard line with a minute to play, but a Cat sack put the Tigers at third and 24, and Goodhue was able to turn Medford over on downs to take over the ball and run out the clock for the big win.

Opsahl was 14 of 25 passing for 138 yards, and one touchdown. Conor O'Reilly made six receptions for 59 yards. Logan Ferguson rushed for 81 yards on 19 carries. Defensive standouts were Schoenfelder and Makae O'Reilly with 11 tackles each, and Conor
