ZUMBROTA – Aaron Fredrickson of Pine Island has always wanted to go up in a hot air balloon. He was able to knock that wish off his bucket list on Friday evening when everything fell into place.

Bethany Reuter, now of the Twin Cities, learned all she needed to know about piloting a hot air balloon from her dad Dan who started flying in 1983 on the Stardrifter in Mapleton. Dan was a certified flight instructor in single and multi-engine airplanes and hot air balloons. Dan passed away three years before Bethany got her license to pilot balloons, but the twenty-five-year old continues the family legacy with her Starburst of Destiny balloon.

Reuter often takes family and friends up in her three-person balloon and that was the case in Zumbrota on Friday when Jason Fredrickson of Victoria, arranged to have his brother Aaron take flight. Jason's son Alex and Reuter are dating.

Starting from a hayfield northwest of Zumbrota, Aaron was hoping to float over Zumbrota. But the winds directed the flight southwest once the balloon got in the air.

The crew of Jason and wife Elizabeth Fredrickson, sisters Jill Plank and Sara Fredrickson both of Zumbrota, and Aaron and his 12-year-old daughter Emma Fredrickson helped get the balloon laid out and ready for flight under Reuter's instruction. While Reuter often flies near her hometown of Mapleton, she drove to Zumbrota to give Aaron and Jason's mom, Elaine, a chance to watch the flight.

Once in the air at about 7 p.m., the light winds moved the three passengers, Aaron, Emma, and Reuter to the southwest over farm fields, across Highway 52, down the Zumbro River, past Shades of Sherwood campground, and on to Wanamingo where the balloon touched down behind Maple Island in Wanamingo as the sun was setting.

"The time went so fast. It seemed like we were in the air

for about 10 minutes," said Aaron Fredrickson after the hour and a half flight. "We got as high as 2,000 feet and were able to see both Zumbrota and Wanamingo. It was so peaceful and really cool."

Plenty of cattle and many deer were spotted on the trip. "We dropped down into the tree tops and got to within 20 feet of someone's patio," remarked Aaron. "No one came out of the house to talk to us."

Once the trip was completed, the Fredrickson crew helped fold up and load the balloon back into Reuter's cargo unit.

A physical therapy student, Reuter does not make as many balloon trips as she used to, but she will take customers up for a ride when time is available.

For Aaron Fredrickson, skydiving is next on his bucket list.

Goodhue County 4-H members will get their day at the fair

ZUMBROTA – When the Goodhue County Fair Board cancelled the 2020 annual get-together in Zumbrota due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it left Goodhue County 4-H members with uncompleted projects.

The good news is that Goodhue County 4-H members will get their day at the fair to have their projects judged. They will be judged the week of August 9-15 at the fairgrounds in Zumbrota.

Individual projects will be judged on Monday, August 10 from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Judges and 4-H members will be scattered around the different buildings with one hour pre-scheduled time brackets that allow judges and 4-H members 10 minutes for judging. Five minutes will be used to clean up before the next 4-H member sits down with the judge.

Animal projects will be judged throughout the week. The horse show will be held on Sunday, August 9 beginning at 9 a.m. Sheep will be in the show arena on Tuesday, August 11 beginning at 9 a.m. Poultry will also be shown on Tuesday beginning at 4 p.m. Rabbits (8 a.m.) and beef (2 p.m.) will be judged on Wednesday, August 12. The swine show will begin at 8 a.m. on Thursday, August 13. Dairy cattle will be judged on Friday, August 14 at 9 a.m., and the goat show will wind up competition on Saturday, August 15 beginning at 9 a.m.

Only 4-H members, immediate family, judges, and volunteers will be allowed on the fairgrounds. Masks will be required for all participants.

There will be no animals stalled at the fairgrounds except for swine the day of the show. Wash racks will only be available to clean up from trailering animals to the grounds. All animals must be

close to ready to show and animals must be kept in their trailers when not in the show arena.

Those participating are encouraged to bring their own food. No food vendors or concessions will be available.

Unlike past years, 4H members with champion and blue ribbon projects will not be advancing to the Minnesota State Fair. The "Great Minnesota Get Together" was cancelled late in the spring.


