Man guilty of driving into Kettle River

A Willow River man who intentionally drove his car into the Kettle River in September has pleaded guilty to the death of a passenger. Preston Paul Prokasky. 43, told police he used methamphetamine before unsuccessfully attempting to ford the river, trapping 47-year-old Eugene Oest-

reich inside the sinking car. Prokasky entered the plea to a felony charge of criminal vehicular homicide Friday in State District Court in Pine City. He is expected to receive a prison term at the lower end of state sentencing guidelines, according to the terms of a plea agreement.

Judge Patrick Flanagan ordered an investigation of Prokasky's background ahead of an April 7 sentencing date.

According to court documents:

Pine County deputies were dispatched to the area of 80124 River Run Road in Willow River at 3:48 p.m. Sept. 16 on a report of a vehicle that went into the Kettle River. When the first deputy arrived, no vehicle

with wet clothing were found along the shore.

Prokasky told the deputy he was driving his 2004 Ford



Escape with Oestreich in the front seat and another passenger, 48-year-old Gerald Darkow, in the back, when he decided to drive across the river. He showed the officer the location where he drove in.

"Prokasky said he did not know the river was so deep and (thought) they could make it across," the com-plaint states. "When they started to sink, he climbed out the driver's side window. Darkow climbed out the window after him. Mr. Oestreich did not make it out of the car."

Darkow told deputies they had been at Prokasky's residence immediately prior to the incident. Darkow said Prokasky told them he was going to drive across the river and that he ignored his request to be let out of the vehicle. After they started to float, Prokasky and Darkow were able to escape, but was visible, but two men never saw Oestreich again.

An investigator followed up with Prokasky, who stated they had been in the Rutledge area prior to the incident and that it was his idea to drive across the river. He said they were on the shore for approximately 20-30 minutes before he drove into the water. He said Oestreich couldn't swim and rolled up his window as they went in.

The investigator asked Prokasky what they had been doing prior to the incident, but he would not provide a detailed answer, saying they had been "on a wild goose chase." Prokasky said Oestreich was a friend who had been living with him up until the previous night, when he kicked him out. Prokasky further admitted to using meth with his two

The Ford Escape was located eventually in approximately 14 feet of water, with Oestreich's body still inside. The Midwest Medical Examiner's Office cited drowning as the cause of death.

Prokasky has multiple prior convictions related to driving while intoxicated, among other traffic offenses.

Can passengers put feet on dash?

Ask A Trooper

Q: I often see front-seat passengers in vehicles with their feet on the dash. Is there a law that prohibits this? I can't help but wonder what would happen in the event that the air bags deploy.

A: There is no law that prohibits a passenger from placing their feet on the dashboard while the vehicle is in motion. Passengers who put their feet up in a moving vehicle could be putting themselves at even greater risk of injury in the event of a crash.

It comes down to using good judgment. Airbags are designed to cushion the head and chest of an adult passenger sitting in an upright position when wearing a correctly fitted seat belt.

If the passenger is sitting incorrectly, there is a greater risk of injury in a crash. This could result in their knees being forced into their chest or face that could cause a serious injury or death. There is also a risk of leg fractures or spinal injuries.

Here are some recommendations and information on airbag safety from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration:

▶ When there is a moderate to severe crash, a signal is sent from the air bag system's

electronic control unit to the inflator within the air bag module.

► An igniter in the inflator starts a chemical reaction that produces a harmless gas, which inflates the air bag within the blink of an eye - or less than 1/20th of a second.

Side-impact air bags inflate even more quickly since there is less space between the occupant and the striking object, such as the interior of the vehicle,

another vehicle, a tree, or a pole.

Because air bags deploy very rapidly, serious or sometimes fatal injuries can occur if the occupant is too close to — or is in direct contact with —the air bag when it first begins to deploy.

Sitting as far back from the steering wheel or dashboard as possible and using seat belts help prevent occupants from being "too close" to a deploying frontal air bag.

I highly recommend that you never place your feet on the dashboard while the vehicle is in motion.

THE TOWN'S WASTEWATER SYSTEM The Town Board adopted Ordinance No. 2020-01 to prohibit the inflow and in-filtration of clear water into its wastewa-ter system from those properties within the Town connected to the system. The restrictions and requirements are adopt-ed to comply with those imposed on the Town as a WLSSD municipal customer. The ordinance requires, with certain ex-emptions, a property owner to obtain a certificate of compliance related to floor drains, sump pumps, and the service lat-eral connecting the property to the sys-tem in certain cases, including when a property is sold. The ordinance sets out the requirements associated with the in-spection required to obtain a certificate of compliance and imposes penalties for failure to comply.
