"To cheer everybody
up," said Lageson when
asked why he does it. "It
makes an impression on
people. It cheers me up
when I go down the drive
way."

Lageson enjoys listening to the traffic as his tree shines through the dark of the night. He lights it from about 5 p.m. to 7:30 a.m. every day from Thanksgiving until mid-January. "Semis really like it," he says. "They honk and hit the rumble strips," he added.

This year Lageson added 12,000 new lights to the tree. He's not even sure how many are on the tree,
