Advanced Placement (AP) to College In Schools (CIS) for students enrolled in advanced English at the high school level. Students benefit from postsecondary instruction on KMS school grounds without traveling to nearby colleges, eliminating the stresses and complications of matching a college schedule with a high school one so the student can participate in co-curricular and extracurricular activities -- as in the Post Secondary Educational Option (PSEO) program. For the CIS program, classes will be taught in collaboration with Southwest Minnesota State University.

Heidelberger mentioned upwards of five post-secondary institutions KMS works in conjunction with, a number that includes the career tech courses offered.

At the high school level, St. Cloud State University is another college with which KMS has connections.

"No matter what direction our students think they're going, we provide them with opportunities to be successful," said Heidelberger.

And another change is that on July 30th the State of Minnesota returned authority to local schools allowing districts to determine guidelines at a local level.

"We're not hearing much about marked changes passed on from the state," said Heidelberger.

"There has been lots of discussion about learning loss across the country and how you remedy this when some students have been hybrid, connected at a distance, some not. We had summer school this year for students who needed credits recovered, brushing up on reading and math."

Overall, attendance numbers were good throughout last school year.

And from open houses onward, the plan is to receive students very typically as in any typical fall. In general, students should anticipate the familiarity of routines come September.

sought.

Hilleren's focus now is on raising the funds locally.

Hilleren says his passion for seeing the clocks restored to working order is part of a 123-year-old project. Back in the late 1890s, the county commissioners envisioned a courthouse that included a clocktower. From 1897 until 1975, there was just the brick outline and inset of where the clock faces, and hands were to go. In 1976, a group of commissioners said it was time to finish the courthouse with the clocks, Hilleren said.

"You have the opportunity now to keep the 123-year-old



dream alive. I don't care how it gets done. I am just giving you information," he told commissioners last month.
