Not so fast! After applying he discovered that Minnesota would count a portion of his monthly Social Security income of \$1,900 against his unemployment aid, effectively reducing it to zero.

He went from having additional money to be able to do some extra things to hav-

ing barely enough to cover monthly expenses.

According to AARP the pandemic has brought to light this little-known longstanding provision in state law that reduces unemployment benefits for certain sidelined workers, who also receive Social Security.

However, help may be on the way as there is an effort backed by AARP Minnesota to end that practice. Proponents say that's necessary to help older Minnesotans collect their full unemployment benefits if they lose their jobs.

According to DFL representative Jim Davnie of Minneapolis, it is a matter of fairness and respect for older workers. Davnie is writing the legislation. Minnesota is the only state to have not repealed the Social Security offset laws. Hopefully this legislation will pass this session to help older workers get their fair share.


