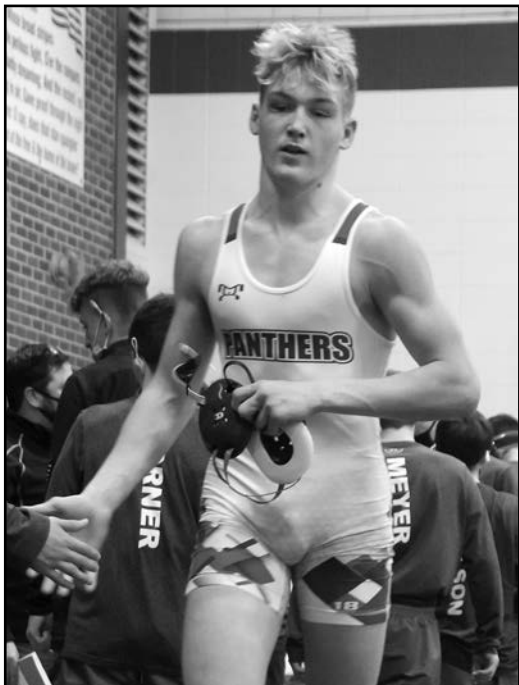
A SPECTACULAR SATURDAY

Wrestlers take down United, Adrian/Ellsworth in weekend triangular

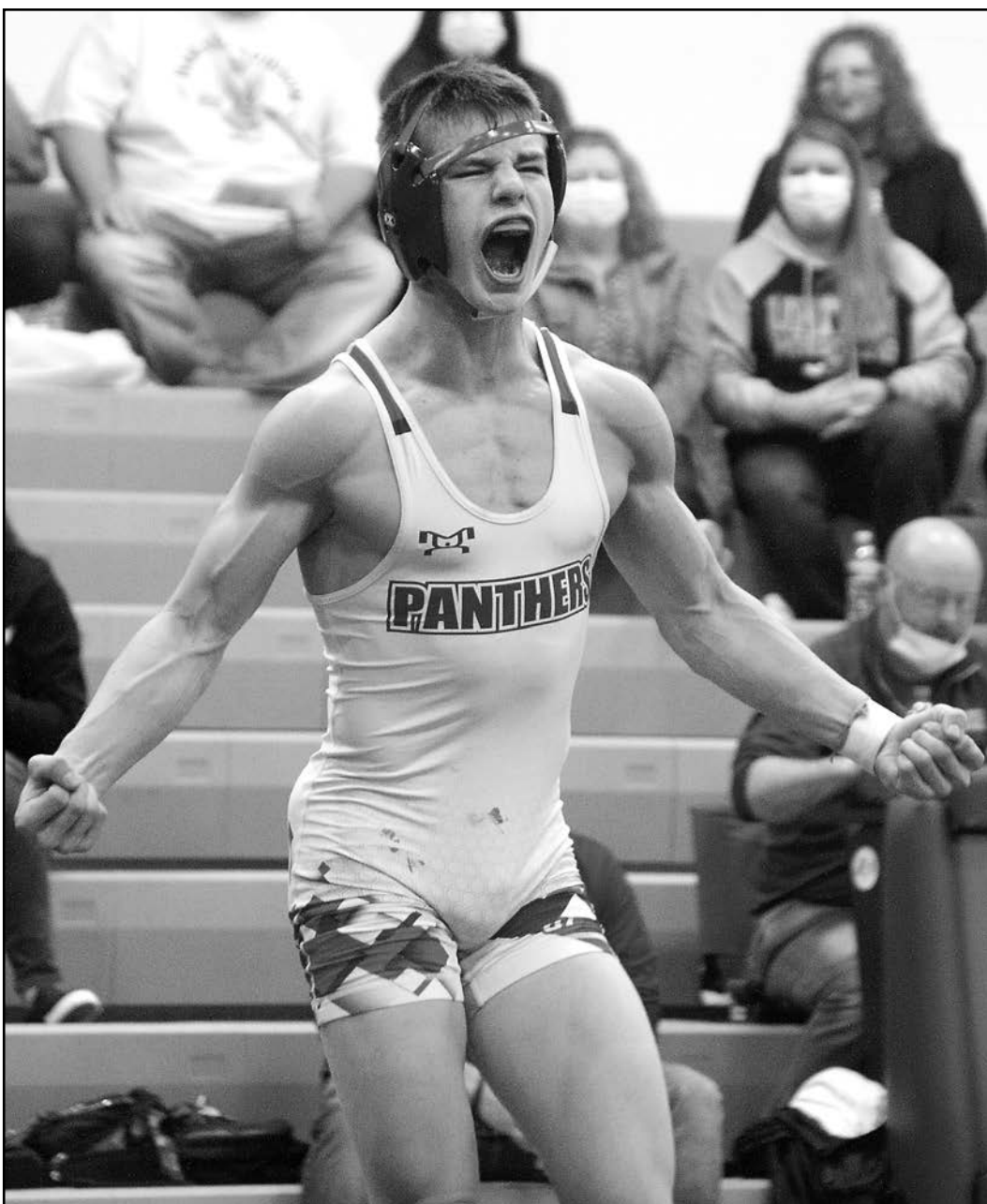

Saturdays are often when the best parties are held, and the Tracy-Milroy-Balaton/Westbrook-Walnut Grove wrestling team threw a big one this past weekend.

In front of its largest crowd of the season — three tickets per wrestler are now allowed for the home team — the Panthers defeated United (Dawson-Boyd/Lac qui Parle/Monte-video) in a thrilling 32-30 dual, then crushed Adrian/Ellsworth for the second time in a week, 64-9, in its final home triangular of the

season Saturday. Saturday's bouts were the exclamation point to a busy week for the Panthers, who for the first time competed in six duals in a one-week span.

"I was very happy with the attitude and effort of our guys," TMB/WWG coach Karl Campbell said. "Great dual versus United. It was fun to come out on top and fun for our fans. It was the largest crowd we have got to have so far with three tickets per wrestler, and our fans obviously took advantage."

BOYS HAVE THEIR WAY WITH YME

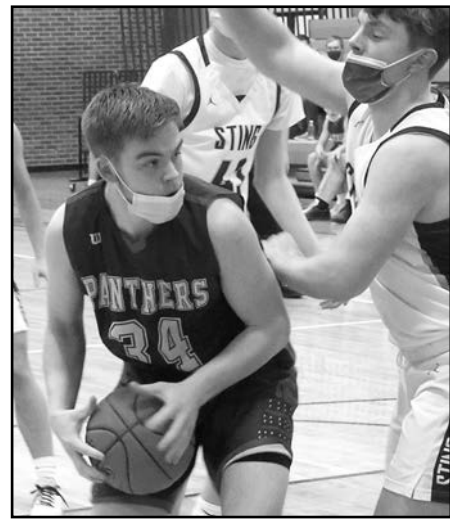
