BORCHERT'S BENCH: a place to rest and reflect

More than 60 family members, friends and former students and athletes gathered together on Friday at Eastbay Park in Balaton to dedicate a brand new bench in memory of the late Ron Borchert.

The dedication was part of a legacy gift initiated by members of the Balaton High School Class of 1969 two years ago when they came together to celebrate their 50th class reunion during the 2019 Fun Fest weekend.

"Things seldom get done as a solo effort, unless of course, you're on the golf course, then it's a solo effort," said Brad Knudson, legacy gift organizer and Class of '69 graduate. "Our activities over the past couple of years for the Class of '69 were certainly a team effort."

Knudson explained that he and his classmates talked first about honoring the six class members who had died and that the legacy gift concept grew from there.

"On the far corner of the park here, there's four memory trees planted, and we'll be planting two more for the six classmates that have passed," he said. "The other piece of our legacy gift is to plant (a total of) 48 trees amongst the parks in Balaton. And then we also have the memorial bench for Coach Borchert, which is certainly a very powerful memory."

Borchert was a longtime teacher and coach at Balaton High School. He died at the age of 86 on Dec. 13, 2019.
