competitive person and I want to do whatever it takes to win," she said. As just a sophomore, that competitiveness has provided Norrid the chance to qualify for five straight state meets, but in order for her to achieve that she'll have to become an even faster swimmer.

Even though that will take a lot of hard work, Fuller has no doubt she can do it.

"Logan isn't afraid of putting in the time/work to improve herself. I always tell the swimmers that the easiest way to get faster in season is to get stronger out of season," he said.

Norrid agrees that increasing her fitness will be key to becoming even better.

"I think at this point I'm not going to grow much more (I'm 5'2) and I have pretty good stroke technique so I'll need to work faster turns and underwaters. I will also need to get stronger," she said.

While she's the one who ultimately has to put the work in to become faster and stronger, she recognizes that her three

wouldn't have been possible with her team of supporters.

"I'd like to thank my parents, Jacob and Danielle Norrid, for giving up so much of their time to drive me to practice, paying for my new equipment and suits, and letting me travel across the country to meets and camps. Another person I'd like to thank is my little sister, Dylann Norrid, she is my biggest cheerleader. I was very proud of her. She had the opportunity to swim varsity this year as a seventh grader. She swam at the section meet in the 200 IM and also won her varsity letter. Whenever my parents take videos of my races, she's the only one you can hear cheering.

"I'd like also thank Owatonna Live for streaming every meet, so everyone could watch, Mr. Eggermont for leading our strength training for most of the season, Owatonna Athletics and Owatonna Swimming Association for all the support for our program and finally, I'd like to thank all of my coaches including Isaiah Fuller and my club coaches for training me to become the best swimmer I can be."


The meeting also yielded the reelection of several directors. Five incumbent board members were reelected for a three-year term: Mark Ditlevson, Glen


