# **Bison open season 2-3 at two invites**

Five matches in two days come against three section opponents at Champlin Park, Coon Rapids invites

The Buffalo girls' tennis team got an early look at some of the competition this year in Section 5AA.

With back-to-back invites to open the season last weekend at Champlin Park and Coon Rapids, the Bison opened with a pair of defeats last Friday to section opponents Champlin Park and Rogers.

The opening match of the season saw Buffalo get three of the seven points in a 4-3 loss to Champlin Park. One of those points was a 6-2, 6-2 victory by Anna Lee over Alex Repplier at the top-singles spot.

Bison doubles teams took two-of-three points. Alaina Lee and Ellie Stonecipher won a 10-2 super-set tiebreaker at No. 1 doubles. Lee and Stonecipher battled back after losing the first set 6-2, but forced the tiebreaker with a 6-3 win in the second set.

Buffalo's Aspen Adams and Megan Steinmetz also battled back at the No. 3 pairing. They dropped the opening set 7-5, but took the final two sets 6-4 and 10-8 in the super-set tiebreaker.

Match two of the invite saw a veteran Rogers squad earn a 5-2 victory. The Royals won three-of-four singles matchups and twoof-three doubles. Anna Lee defeated Abby Johnson 6-1, 6-1 for the lone singles win. Alaina Lee won her first set 6-1 over Anna Luksik at the two spot, but trailing 4-3 in set two, fatigue kicked in and Lee lost by injury default.

Adams and Steinmetz again won their No. 3 doubles match 6-4, 7-5. Adams, a junior, and Steinmetz, a sophomore, are new to this year's varsity lineup. Steinmetz did see some exhibition matches a year ago.

"Aspen and Megan have little to no varsity experience," said Head Coach

two section opponents.

"It's important to get good section results for post-season play," Revenig said. "But I know this team has lots of growth coming. We won't be the same team when we get to post-season play." Buffalo did notch a key section win with a 6-1 victory over the host school in last Saturday's Coon Rapids Invite.

The Bison dominated the Cardinals in singles play, winning all four matchups by 6-0, 6-0 scores. Anna Lee, Kiley Herbst, Grace Murphy, and Lauren Berg each played in the top-four spots, respectively. Alaina Lee and Stonecipher won 6-0, 6-1 at the top-doubles spot. Adams and Steinmetz won 6-2, 6-1 at the third position.

Buffalo went 2-1 at Coon Rapids. The other win was a 4-3 victory over Cretin-Derham Hall. Hibbing went a perfect 3-0 during the day, which included a 4-3 win over the Bison.

CDH and Buffalo split the four singles points with Anna Lee defeating Lily Cade 6-2, 7-5 at the top spot. Elise Lubben won at No. 3 singles 6-4, 6-4. Alaina Lee and Stonecipher, along with Adams and Steinmetz each won their doubles matches.

Anna Lee's 6-0, 6-1 win at No. 1 singles over Hibbing's Annika Lundell improved Lee's record to 5-0. The same can be said for No. 3 doubles partners Adams and Steinmetz, who won their match over the Bluejackets 3-6, 6-2, 6-3. Buffalo's third point in the match was a 6-3, 1-6, 6-4 victory at No. 3 singles by Elise Lubben.

"It was great to get this many matches in right away to start the season," Revenig said. "It's a great way to grow as a team, see where people are, and try some different lineups."

The Bison continued their run of invites to open the season with a quadrangular against three Duluth Area schools on Wednesday, Aug. 25 at various sites. Buffalo faced Duluth East, Hermantown and Marshall. Details of this invite were not available due to deadline.
