## Perfect Eagles bid emotional goodbye to tennis season

Rochester Lourdes has six seniors on this year's girls tennis team. They had their final match Tuesday, ending an unblemished season.

## Unbeaten and unchallenged.

And sad. Sad that it's done.

That sums up the Rochester Lourdes girls tennis team's year, with COVID-19 having taken a dent out of so many of the things that the Eagles normally experience in a season.

One of the biggest omissions was the state tournament, which Lourdes would have qualified for on Tuesday for the 25th straight year.

Its 7-0 win over Stewartville in the Section 1A tournament finals at the Rochester Tennis Connection Outdoor Site would in a normal year have left them preparing hotel accommodations, a trip to the Mall of American, etc., as it readied for the state tournament at Reed-Sweatt Tennis Center in Minneapolis.



But due to the pandemic, the Minnesota State High School League has eliminated all fall state tournaments.

So, Lourdes was left to celebrate its last match on Tuesday — which like all of them this year — ended in a rout.

Lourdes, for the fourth time this season, beat Stewartville. The Eagles won 7-0. That was predictable as Lourdes won all 10 of its duals this season by that same score.

That was a first, though it happened as Lourdes stuck with a completely Hiawatha Valley League schedule to help keep away from COVID-19. The less variety to the schedule, was the thinking, the less chance to make contact with someone who does have the virus.

But now, it's over. And for the six seniors on the team, it's really over.

sets at every position. The only channenging match was at No. 1 dodnes, where boundes bydiney Emott and Elyse Palen won 7-6 (7-2 tie-breaker), 6-0.

That it was more difficult for Lourdes at that spot wasn't a surprise.

"Stewartville has a really good No. 1 doubles team (Miah Mikel and Tessa Lanzel)," Eagles coach David Pettengill said. "We had good matches with them every time we played them."

Lourdes' outgoing six seniors are Spading, Elliott, No. 2 doubles players Karin Hayford and Mellisa Stocker, and No. 3 doubles players Hannah Roth and Annabel Boughey.

All of them were members of Lourdes' team that finished runnerup at state to Blake a year ago, losing 6-1 to the Bears in the finals.

This year, their imagination told them that it would have been much closer had the two met again at state.

Stewartville coach Kelly Manley believes they're right.

"I think this is one of the best teams that Lourdes has had in years," he said. "What makes them so tough is that they are so deep."

They are passionate, too. Not only about tennis, but each other.

It made Tuesday's season-ending — and for six seniors, career ending — dual tough to take.

They didn't want this Lourdes tennis experience to end.

"It is very emotional," Roth said. "I love tennis and my best friend (Boughey) is my doubles partner. We've been playing together since eighth grade. Our whole team, we are all like a family. We are super tight knit. There will be so many lasting memories. I loved our bus rides, with all of us seniors sitting in the back and talking about fun stuff. All of those bonding memories. It was just so much fun."

The Lourdes underclassmen are having trouble visualizing life without that senior six.

"I am so sad to see them go," said Lourdes No. 1 singls player Ryann Witter, a sophomore. "I had so much fun with them and they have carried us for the past 4-5 years. They've been the core of our team. It's tough to lose them."

• Stewartville's season ended 9-5 overall. The Tigers got to the final with a hard-earned 4-3 win over Cannon Falls. a team that had beaten it earlier in the season.


Stewartville coach Manley praised his team's "flexibility," with so many players able to play multiple spots.
