Since the city's Sesquicentennial was the main inspiration for the ice a small sledding hill maze, the milestone was worked into the design Organizers wanted to of the maze: When seen replace the sledding hill from above, "DL 150" is spelled out.

Davis conceptualized the project with a CAD drawing (a high-ly detailed computer illustration) as a guidepost, and then workers constructed the maze by hand.

The ice blocks used to build the maze were pulled from the lake during this year's ice harvest, along with all the blocks that were pulled for construction of the ice palace. Akers said the blocks measure about 22-by-44 inches each.
