The 2022 Rice County Fair will be held from July 20 through July 24 in Faribault.

There are tons of events for all ages. Among the events which will be held daily include Tuey the Juggler, The Strong Man, Electric Fusion, Brodini Family Comedy and Magic Show, and their daily prize drawings.

The grandstand events this year include Midwest All Star Wrestling Thursday, July 21 at 7 p.m., Barnes PRCA Rodeo Friday, July 22 at 7 p.m., NTPA Truck and Tractor Pull Saturday, July 23 at 7 p.m., and Power Wheels and the Demolition Derby, starting at 4 p.m. Sunday, July 24.

Other major events include the Best of Best Awards program at 9 a.m. and the Kids Pedal Tractor Pull at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20.

Just seeing the kids doing something for others is what makes Novack smile.

"Mental health is so important," she stated. "I think it's great the counties are involving young kids in this. It's never too early to start talking about mental health awareness in simple ways like this... giving the kids a chance to do something good for other people."

The rocks and paint were delivered to the participating daycares last week. All of the painting supplies were purchased using the COVID-19 Recovery Fund 2022, but the rocks were donated by Le Sueur and Waseca County farmers.

"Public Health wanted to incorporate the farming community into this project because mental health is a huge challenge area among farming and rural communities," Ayers explained. "This is especially concerning because rural areas take a big hit from mental challenges as the resources are limited. A ratio of 1,960 people per mental health provider is located in rural or isolated areas as compared to 340 people per provider in metropolitan areas."

Public Health representatives will deliver the painted rocks to Colony Court in Waseca, Central Health Care in Le Center, Horizon Place in Le Center, and Traditions in both Montgomery and Waterville.

"Mental health is a daily occurrence, and a lot of normal activities contribute to our overall mental health," Ayers stated. "For example, what we read, watch, eat, whom we interact with, and observe, all take part in one's mental health. It's usually not the one big single incident that causes one to seek mental health professionals, rath-
