


Taopi families lose homes in Tuesday night storm

The house belongs to Lisa Boe. She isn't here, but her father, Bill, family and neighbors are all removing the items left unharmed.

Bill Boe lives outside of town but heard what he described as a locomotive late Tuesday night. Everyone inside Lisa's house is safe.


"It's one of those miracles," Bill Boe said.

The roof and garage are gone. The walls on the left side of Lisa's house are, too. Though there is plenty of damage to be repaired, Boe isn't worried about that right now. It's happened to others before, he said.



"We aren't the first ones, and we won't be the last," he said.








Scott Hatle, who lives with Lisa Boe, said he was out in the garage late Tuesday night. The strength of the storm caused him to leave the garage and run into the basement. The garage blew over about a minute later.

The high winds damaged multiple houses in Taopi, as well as tore down trees and power lines. The same power lines that Bill Boe said were just redone a few weeks ago.

Preliminary storm damage results of the area from the National Weather Service in La Crosse indicate EF2 wind gusts in the area, meaning wind speeds of 111 to 135 mph.



Terry Voigt and his dog, Rip, felt the floor begin to shake and feared the windows of his home might blow in. Instead, he's facing a bigger problem after the roof came down during the storm. Voigt hit the floor because he doesn't have a basement. Voigt described the experience as "scary."

Meanwhile, the house at 101 Walnut Street has shattered windows and debris covering the yard. A skid steer has been moving tree limbs for over an hour, and two cars in the driveway have blown-out windows.

Down the street, the walls and siding on the east side of a two-story house are gone, exposing the rooms to the elements. The homeowner, who declined to give her name while she worked, said she and her boyfriend were in bed in the second floor bedroom. They had minutes to get up and hide in the stairwell before the storm damaged the home.
