VanDenheuvel had planned to VanDenheuvel had planned to
retire at the end of December. retire at the end of December.
He decided to stay on the crew through February in hopes of finding a new director and recruiting more EMTs.
VanDenheuvel and a few VanDenheuvel and a few
others will be leaving Bertha's service, putting the ambulance in a tough position. They met with the state

services are in the same boat struggling to get EMTs and coverage. Some have had to go out of service for some shifts as

The last meeting with the mbulance crew still left half of the calendar empty for cover age. ${ }^{\text {VanDenheuvel explained he }}$ is speaking with Tri-County, Staples, Parkers Prairie and thers to help cover day shifts.

ing. ing. "We're going to need EMRs on our ambulance service from here on forward, in my opinhon", noted VanDenheuvel. While there are EMRs on

would recruit for just medical calls with the ambulance. "It's not easy but our com-
