Early on Perham wanted to pull out all the stops running a fake punt from their own side of the fifty and the Green Wave came up big with the stop.

“We really thought a punt was coming, so I don't know how Joey Votava made the play or how our guys were ready for it,” says Green Wave Head Coach Ryan Kasowski. “That was a big momentum swing back in our favor.”

The defense came up big all game long limiting

the Yellowjackets to just 63 yards of total offense.

Senior High got the ball to start the second half and drove the ball with determination and capped the drive off with a Tanner Campos 2-yard run to break the 0-0 deadlock.

Early in the fourth quarter after a holding penalty, Sam Schumacher responded with a big catch that helped keep the Green Wave drive alive that ended with a Joey Votava 3-yard touchdown run to put the Green Wave up 14-0.

“That was really the play we needed to keep that drive going and then go down and score after that,” says Coach Kasowski. “That was, that was a tremendous catch.”
