Fighting the invasive spotted lanternfly

When Stephen Nixon recently noticed a "beautiful" spotted lanternfly by his bag as he skateboarded in Brooklyn, he heeded the request of city officials.

He stomped on it.

"I don't like killing things. Not many people do. I'll catch and release cockroaches if I find them in my apartment," Nixon said. But he said it "seems like something worse" if the insect's population explodes.

Kill-on-sight requests in New York City and elsewhere are a part of public campaigns to fight an invasive insect now massing and feeding on plants around much of the Eastern United States. Pretty with red wing markings, the spotted lanternfly is nonetheless a nuisance and a threat - the sort of insect that inspires people to post about squishing and stomping them on so-

St. Cloud man charged with meth, cocaine possession

ST. CLOUD - A St. Cloud man is charged with three felonies after investigators with the Minnesota Violent Offender Task Force uncovered methamphetamine and cocaine at his residence Thursday, according to criminal complaints filed in Stearns County court.

James Michael Latzke, 41, faces first-degree, second-degree and thirddegree felony drug charges.

According to police, Latzke sold an undercover investigator a total of 23.3 grams of meth on July 25 and Aug. 12.

On Thursday, investigators executed a search warrant at Latzke's residence as part of an ongoing investigation into his sale of controlled substances and recovered 25 grams of meth, 12 grams of cocaine, an action rifle, THC cartridges, THC gummies, marijuana and other drug parapherna-

Latzke was booked in the Stearns County Jail and had a court appearance Friday morning.
