Director of Business Services/Human Resources Sandy Linn presented the agreement, noting that it is for two more years. The agreement began on Tuesday, July 26, 2022 and lasts until June 30, 2024. It covers several items from responsibilities to to compensation.

At one point the Starlifter Band had Armed Forces veterans or their family members stand up to be recognized for their service. "It was an enjoyable opportuni-

ent," said Technical Sergeant Rager. The band played a medley of music from the Armed Forces and asked those who served to stand up when it came to music from their branch of the Armed Forces. There were several people who stood up when it came to the Army, Navy, Marines, Coast Guard and when the Air Force was recognized it was noted it is celebrating its 75th anniversary this year. At the sining of "God Bless America" the entire audience stood in reverence for the musical piece.

The band members arrived in New Prague on Wednesday night and spent most of Thursday setting up for the performance.

Tonight (Thursday), Music at the Broz continues at 6:30 p.m. with Timbre Junction, which plays traditional bluegrass, country blues, cowboy and western swing, although they do pull out a few surprises by putting a unique twist on pieces of music.
