Miles racking up for local triathlete

Competing with one kidney, 57-year old Zitur places first in age group, second among females at Buffalo Tri

The year 2016 was a memorable one for Cheryl

The 57-year old resident, of Rogers, donated a kidney to her oldest son, Chris, on June 30 of that year. Just 25 days prior, Zitur set a Buffalo Triathlon Sprint Course record in a time of

One less kidney later, she's still finishing among the top of the pack.

She placed second among 63 females and 10th overall in a time of 1:06.54 in this year's Buffalo Triathlon on Sunday, June 5, at Sturges Park. Elena Hengel, 25, of Wayzata, was the top-female finisher in the Sprint Course in a time of 1:06.10.

Sprint Course totaled 182 triathletes that start with a 0.25-mile swim in Buffalo Lake. A 12.06mile bike ride followed, and 5k run concluded. While temperatures for Sunday's triathlon were in the upper-50s to start the day, Zitur says she was most prepared that day for the swim portion.

"I had done two open water swims earlier in the week, so when you only do a quarter mile, it's easy to acclimate," Zitur said. "The water wasn't bad. What was bad, was the end of the run, where most of it is uphill. The very last mile just wipes you out. It's fun though, when you get to run down into the finish

For Zitur, a veteran of eight Buffalo triathlons, she's been the top-female finisher in four of those eight races.

"It's nice to win, but you don't always get that either," Zitur said, "Mostly, you do this to try and get your personal bests. But I love to bike. I love to swim. Running, I just do it because I have to.

Her range of success covers the national and world level as well.

Zitur plans on competing in the Triple Bypass Bicycle Ride on August 20 in Evergreen, Colorado. The ride travels over three mountain passes and covers 110 miles at nearly 10,000 feet of elevation.

In 2014, she earned a bronze medal competing in the 50-54 female age group at the World Triathlon Grand Final in Edmonton, Alberta. She duplicated her finish the following year at the World Triathlon Grand Final in Chicago.

Zitur was the highest overall finisher among area females, finishing 10th. Andrew Zabel won the overall Spring Course in 58.52. Ted Treise, 28, of Minnetonka, was the high-

est overall finisher in the Olympic Course in a time of 1:53.40. The Olympic Course had 148 triathletes that competed in a 0.9-mile swim, 24.12-mile bike ride, and 10k run.

Robert Kranz, 75, of Princeville, Hawaii was the oldest to compete in Sunday's event. He finished 158th overall in the Sprint Course in a time of 1:46.23.

Bison come up empty from Park Rapids

Buffalo sixth at sections; Ylitalo misses state cut

Only a couple times this season, members of the Buffalo boys' golf team left the course feeling disappointed in their team performance.

Unfortunately for the Bison, one of those meets came at the most important time of the year.

A team score of 663 was sixth overall in the Section 8AAA tournament, which took place over two days, starting Thursday, June 2, and concluding Friday, June 3, at Headwaters Golf Club in Park Rapids.

Alexandria will represent the section at this year's state meet on June 14-15 at Bunker Hills in Coon Rapids. The Cardinals finished first with a score of 628. The Bison concluded day one in sixth place with a score

of 331. The top-six teams and select individuals qualiqualified for day two. While they admit-

tedly had an off day, Buffalo was only 19 strokes back of Brainerd, who led after 18 holes with a Arthur Ylitalo score of 312.

Coach Head Paul Olson said the team remained optimistic heading into the final 18 holes, but the script the following day went similar to the

"The guys started well, but there was so little margin for error, that a few tough holes quickly pushed them back down in the standings," Olson

said. "All year long, they

have played so well as a team, supporting and encouraging each other. When they knew that some of their teammates were struggling, they would

push hard, but this time it was too late. Credit to our guys, even when they were obviously out of contention they never quit.

Buffalo came into the section meet having built some momentum. They finished higher in

the standings than No. 1 ranked Edina during the team's final Lake meet of the season. Buffalo placed third in the final overall Lake

Conference standings. They also set a team record this past season with a low round of 291 in a dual meet at home against Bemidji.

"Unfortunately, their

high level of play during

the season did not carry over into sections," Olson said. "The guys were never able to get on track and feel comfortable. They had had some great days of practice and were excited to compete but struggled early and were playing from behind almost immediately."

Not only did the season end for the team, but no individuals qualified for state, including last year's third-place state finisher Arthur Ylitalo, who finished 14th overall and missed the state cut by six places with a score of 161.

The top-five golfers not on the winning team qualified for state. Joe Korton, of Moorhead, won the section title with a low round of 149 on a par 144.

The pressures of playing from behind, along with a

course that only one Bison

golfer (Ylitalo) had previ-

ously played, factored in.

Weather also was a factor. "The high winds came up later in the morning,'

Olson said. "That made it even more difficult to make a move up the standings. Golf is unique in that it requires four-plus hours of focus and playing within your game. Once the wheels start to spin and you try harder, it can have the opposite effect.

Buffalo's top-four scorers all finished in the top-37 in the field. Ylitalo was low at 161. Jayce Hansen finished 21st at 165. Harvey Ylitalo was 22nd at 166. Justin Swenson was 37th at 173. Sam Mahannah shot

174 and Russell Ylitalo 178. While moods were down, Olson felt the season was a

success. "Though we were all disappointed in the outcome, the guys knew they should not let these two days define their season, or who they are," Olson said.

"Over the spring, they had accomplished a lot and grown as both golfers and individuals. Coach Mark Pokorney and I couldn't be more proud of them.'
