A section finals to remember

A total of 22 Alexandria athletes qualify for state meet

ALEXANDRIA - The Alexandria track and field programs built off a solid start in Detroit Lakes from June 1 with a strong showing at home on Saturday to win the Section 8AA titles. The Alexan-dria girls team scored 165.75 points and won by 30 points over runner-up Rocori, while the boys team scored 169.50 points and won by 27 points over runner-up Willmar.

"Our athletes have been improving all the way through the season," Alexandria boys head coach Mike Empting said. "We tell the kids from the beginning that it's all about putting you at your best at the end of the season. These kids have done it."

For the girls, this section title win is their 11th straight.

"I'm thrilled for the girls as a team," Alexandria girls head coach Meghan Orge-man said. "Victory is always something that you celebrate and it's always a goal. I just feel like this is the icing on the cake of a really special season and we've got even more to come.'

Both programs also won section true team titles back in May.

After day one of the section meet, five Alexandria girls and two boys had already punched their tickets to the MSHSL Class AA State Tournament at St. Michael-Albertville on June 9-11. On Saturday, nine more boys and six more girls punched their tickets.

The top two individuals and relays from each event automatically qualify for the state meet.

Alexandria's Christian Doumbia earned his way to state by finishing second in the 100m dash (11.03), first in the 200m (22.72) and first in the 400m (49.63).

"He will do whatever it takes to win," Orgeman said of Doumbia. "I cannot wait to see what he will run at state. The 400 is relatively new to him, so it's fun to see him drop a hammer like he did in the 400."

On the girls side, Aleah Miller won the 1600m run (4:56.16) and Hailie Kent, who had already qualified for the state tournament in the long jump, took first place in the triple jump (37-05.00) on Saturday.

One win from a title

Cardinals play Little Falls for 8-3A championship Wednesday

St. Cloud ■he Alexandria baseball team is one win away from securing its fifth state tournament entry in program history and first since 2018, and the Cardinals have two chances to get that win. Alexandria is the

lone unbeaten team left in the Section 8-3A playoffs after beating Willmar (15-7) 8-1 at the Municipal Athletic Complex in St. Cloud on Saturday afternoon. Willmar, Sauk Rapids-Rice and Rocori were all eliminated from the playoffs on Saturday.

The Cardinals (18-5) will play sixth-seeded Little Falls (12-11) at 4 p.m. on Wednesday back at the MAC in St. Cloud. Little Falls beat Rocori 2-1 on Saturday and would have to beat Alexandria twice on Wednesday to win the section. Alexandria beat Little Falls 4-0 on May

"We can't overthink it too much with us beating them last time," Alexandria senior infielder Reed Reisdorf said. "They have nothing to lose. We still have to put all our stuff

out there and throw our best game at them."

Alexandria jumped on Willmar with a secondinning, solo home run from senior JD Hennen.

Brock Lerfald and Caleb Runge drove in third-inning runs with a single and double, respectively, to make it

Alexandria blew the game open in the top of the sixth with four runs. Nate Hammerback doubled to lead off that inning with his third hit of the game. Reisdorf drove in a run with a perfectly-placed squeeze bunt, and Lake Hagen then cleared the bases with a three-run double to make it 7-1. Reisdorf singled in the game's final run in the seventh. "That felt good,"

Hagen said of his sixthinning double. "There was an altercation the last inning, and it felt good to put it in their faces a bit."

Willmar scored its only run in the bottom of the fifth on an overturned call at the plate. Mason Madsen, Jason Malmgren and Carter Schow all singled for Willmar to load the bases with one out.

At that point, the Cardinals were trailing Brainerd by four shots heading into the second round. Josh Lang is the junior varsity coach for Alexan-


