Osakis sends 10 to state Championships

Wales and Bright qualify

Alexandria Echo Press PELICAN RAPIDS The Osakis track and field program is sending 10 athletes to the Class A MSHSL Track and Field State Championships on June 9-11 at St. Michael-Albertville.

Three Osakis relay teams, the 4x100, 4x200 and 4x400 teams on the girls' side, have qualified with top-two finishes at the Section 6A track and field meet from Thursday. The Silverstreaks finished with 75 meet points and earned second place behind Perham (105.5).

The top two individuals and top two relays from the section meet qualify for state.

"We are excited about getting a bunch of kids down to state. This is one of the biggest groups that we've had in a while," Osakis head coach Lee VanNyhuis said.

In the 4x100, sophomore Hailey Walker, sophomore Kiana Kendall, senior Mara VanNyhuis and Tessa Stanek won the Section 6A title (51.95).



Orgeman said Miller running the 1600m in less than five minutes was one of the high points of the meet.

"There were extreme highs across the board and you look at how hard they've trained this sea-son, how hard they've worked, they deserve it," Orgeman said.

For Kent, her next goal is to improve on her runner-up finish in last year's state tournament. "Hailie's ready," Orge-

man said. "I trust her training and our taper is going to make her pop at the right time. For her, the more competition, the better; the higher the honor, the better she jumps."

Along with Addison Fettig, Elena Fuglestad and Elle Heydt, Kent also qualified in the 4x100 relay by finishing second with a time of 51.26.

"We've been working really hard the last couple of weeks on our handoffs and getting them consistent," Kent said. "We were able to have really fast, clean handoffs, and then we had to battle at the end there a little bit to get that second-place finish."

Alexandria's depth in the triple jump was on display on Saturday as it had three athletes finish

in the top five. Outside of Kent's first place finish, Ella Steussy finished third (36-00.50) and Marisa Rousu finished fifth (34-02.50).

Steussy, a junior, had been in second place until Kent's 37-05.00 jump.

"We just hugged and cried," Orgeman said of Steussy after the event. "I congratulated her on an impressive season. She's come so far this year. She was just happy for her teammates and hugged her teammates. So we kind of all just had all those emotions come together at once. She had an incredible 36-foot jump."

Melrose Area's Isabelle Jaenicke edged out a second place finish over Steussy by posting a jump of 36-01.50.

"She pushes me a lot," Kent said about Steussy. 'I love having someone on my team to compete with. That hasn't really been the case for the last few years. But Ella coming up has really been not only exciting for her but exciting for me. I know we'll have a strong jumps team next year. She's been so great and she's always ready to go.'

Like Kent did on the girls side, Will Heydt, the defending boys tri-ple jump state champion, also qualified for a track event on Saturday after having already qualified for the state tournament in the triple jump. Heydt, Venald Becker, Daniel

Jackson and Gavin Ashmore finished second in the 4x200 (1:33.17).

'Gavin coming up that last stretch, Daniel in second and Venald starting, gave me a great lead," Heydt said. "I had a slingshot off that curve and got caught by one guy but still finished it out and got second."

Heydt has his sights set on being a back-to-back triple jump state champion.

"My mindset for state is just to jump hard, run hard and compete," he said.

Empting said that he could sense the desire from Will Heydt to win back-to-back state titles.

"He's pretty hungry to go back there, repeat and hang on to his title as a triple jump state cham-pion," Empting said. "He's certainly not going to sneak up on anyone this year. He's a known factor out there in the triple jump world across the state."

Kent, Will Heydt, as well as Joey Lanoux (second place, shot put), Sophia Vinje (first place, discus), Amaria Sowada (second place, discus), and Alison Krasky (second place, long jump) are the Alexandria field athletes who have qualified for the state tournament.

The Cardinals' girls team qualified for the state tournament in not only the 4x100 relay but also in the 4x400 and 4x800.
