# LIMITING THE NEGATIVE PLAYS IS UND QB'S MISSION

he official team stats for the spring of 2021 indicate UND quarterback Tommy Schuster was sacked twice for a total loss yardage of 3

On Wednesday morning, Schuster could only recall one of the sacks, and he made sure to note an asterisk.

The sack came in a road win at Western Illinois.

"That was on a naked, so it wasn't really a sack because the offensive line was blocking left," Schuster said.

Schuster's ability to avoid sacks and lead an offense with few negative plays was a key to his first full season as the starter in which the Fighting Hawks went 5-2 and advanced to the FCS quarterfinals.

Schuster's sophomore campaign kicks off Saturday at 2 p.m. when UND takes on Idaho State at Holt Arena in

UND, ranked No. 8 in the latest preseason poll, led the Missouri Valley Football Conference and was third in the FCS with just 24 negative plays in the spring.

"Great offensive line play and getting the ball out on time and not sitting in the pocket screwing around," Schuster explained of the few negative plays. "The offensive line does a great job, and I don't have to worry too much about what's going on.

UND running back Otis Weah, a Walter Payton Award finalist in the spring, proved to be tough to tackle and that helped UND's low number of negative plays.

Weah had 102 carries in the spring and only accounted for a loss of 5 yards the entire season. Schuster, meanwhile,

threw just five interceptions to go with his 10 passing touchdowns. Schuster, who was named to the All-Missouri Valley preseason first team, had a 65.5 percent completion percentage a year ago and threw for 1,428 yards.

NEW YORK - Victoria Azarenka moved into the U.S. Open third round with a 6-3 7-6 (1) win over Italy's Jasmine Paolini on Wednesday, saying she was happy to be back playing in front of crowds at Flushing Meadows, especially vaccinated fans.

Azarenka made it to the final last year before losing to Naomi Osaka but did it as COVID-19 restrictions barred spectators from the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center.

This year the fans are back but only those who have proof of vaccination and the 18th-seeded Belarusian admitted confusion over why the rules do not extend to

players as well.
"It was great to be back playing in front of fans and mostly vaccinated," said the twice Australian Open champion, who pulled out of a WTA Tour event in April because it coincided with her scheduled COVID-19 vaccination.

"To me that's a bit bizarre that fans have to be vaccinated and players are not.

"So I think that in my opinion, it's inevitable that it will be mandated at some point, like other leagues are doing.
