Potential COVID rules from OSHA reviewed

BEMIDJI — New employee rules related to the coronavirus pandemic may be on the way for Beltrami County from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

During its work session Tuesday, Nov. 16, the Beltrami County Board of Commissioners were briefed on the proposed COVID standards by OSHA. According to the report, the OSHA rules would apply to the county as it's an employer with more than 100 workers.

There are two main rules the county has to consider. The first is related to Medicare and Medicaid services, which require virtually all staff to be vaccinated with limited exceptions.

County Administrator Tom Barry said this would only be applied to health services provided to those who receive Medicare or Medicaid.

The second rule, which would be more wide-reaching, is the OSHA Emergency Temporary Standard. The ETS requires workers to be either vaccinated, or have mandatory testing and use of face masks.

Some employees would be exempt from the ETS, though. Those who do not report to a workplace with other people, employees who work from home and those who work outdoors would all be exempt.

Both rules have been challenged in federal court, and an injunction has been placed on the latter. However, Barry said both of the rules, or some form of

Luna works as second electronic detection K9 for BCA

K9 Luna has a very particular set of skills. The 3-year-old English Labrador is one of just two K9s in Minnesota who are specially trained to locate electronic evidence by detecting triphenylphosphine, or TPPO, a chemical coating found on electronic devices.

Working with the Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension,

like drug or arson dogs, these K9s are trained to detect evidence in criminal investigations and are able to locate electronics by sniffing out TPPO on devices like phones, laptops and SD cards.

In cases of child exploitation or other crimes where electronic evidence is vital, these K9s play a big part in the investigation. It's a job that very few K9s are trained to do – in fact, only about 60 in the country. For

K9 Luna, though, it's just another day at the office.

Luna is the state's second electronic detection K9, with the first being K9 Sota, another 3-year-old English Labrador who joined the BCA in May 2020 and is stationed at its state headquarters in St. Paul.

Due to K9 Sota's success and a growing number of cases involving electronic evidence, Luna was brought onto the team and placed at the Bemidji Regional Office

just under a year later.

To BCA Superintendent Drew Evans, the emotional support that Luna and Sota provide is a great side-benefit for BCA agents and office staff.

"This is really difficult casework, you're looking at children being abused on a regular basis," Evans said. "It can be challenging for our agents who have to endure that work because

"It's exciting to be back in full force," Peterson said. "We have a vision to really make Bemidji the true Christmas city of the north by continuing to add new displays every year."


Festivities will kick off Friday morning in the Tourist Information Center with Santa's

Red Lake to be a part of \$6.6M electric vehicle charging project

RED LAKE — In an effort to connect Red Lake, Standing Rock and other tribal nations throughout the upper Midwest with electronic vehicle charging stations, Minneapolis-based Native Sun Community Power Development and over two dozen of its partners will make use of a recently awarded \$6.67 million from the U.S. Department of Energy Vehicle Technologies Office.

"This is a great example of direct federal spending on new infrastructure in underserved communities," Native Sun Executive Director Bob Blake said in a release. "Native Sun and our partners hope to see more projects like this replicated around the

FARGO, N.D. – The Fargo Veterans Affairs Health Care System will hold a COVID-19 vaccine booster clinic from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 22, at the Bemidji VA Clinic, 1217 Anne St. NW.

Those eligible for booster doses include veterans, spouses and caregivers who fall into one of the following groups:

- ▶ Anyone 65 or older.
- ▶ Anyone 18 or older who lives in long-term care settings, has underlying medical conditions or lives/works in high-risk settings.
- ▶ Anyone 18 or older who received Johnson and Johnson as their primary COVID-19 vaccination.

"Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. The CDC's recommendations allow for mix-and-match dos-

ing for booster shots," a release said. "The Fargo VA Health Care System is administering only Moderna and Johnson and Johnson COVID-19 vaccine booster doses at this time."



MDH honors Leech Lake vaccination effort with award

CASS LAKE — Health agencies in the Leech Lake Nation that partnered to administer vaccines have been honored by the Minnesota Department of Health.

According to a release, the MDH gave its 2021 Minnesota Rural Health Team Award to the Cass Lake Indian Health Service and the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe Health Division. In 15 events by the two agencies, 12,096 vaccines were provided to residents from across the region.

The Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe became likely the first tribal nation in the country to receive

the COVID-19 vaccine as the initial doses were administered on Dec. 14, 2020.

From January through April, the tribal agencies collaborated to develop and implement a mass immunization model that would increase access to COVID-19 vaccines for rural Minnesotans.

While both organizations traditionally provide care to eligible Native Americans, the collective team provided vaccinations to anyone who needed a dose. The team's plan to provide vaccinations to all regardless of demographics was approved by the Indian Health

Service and Tribal leadership.

Of the vaccines administered, 57% of those self-identified as non-Native American. Additionally, 70% of the community's elders were vaccinated before it was a national goal and 70% of Cass Lake Indian Health Service's user population was vaccinated before President Joe Biden's July 4 goal.

The Cass Lake IHS and Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe Health Division team are considered one of the best and fastest vaccine administration teams in the state, the release said. Their vaccination model is now

considered a best practice and has garnered the attention of federal, state and private sector partners across the nation.

"When the Bemidji Area Indian Health Service Director received

a directive from the White House to provide assistance with COVID vaccinations in Michigan, team members flew there to recreate and carry out two successful missions," the release said. "They have

demonstrated that a small health care organization and its community partners can rapidly plan and deploy health care measures within a 48- to 72-hour window for the entire community."

NTC Foundation raises more than \$30,000 during Day of Giving event

BEMIDJI — The Northwest Technical College Foundation raised \$31,470 during its Third Annual Day of Giving on Nov. 9 to establish an endowed scholarship fund for Bemidji Career Academies graduates planning to attend NTC.

This exceeds their fundraising goal of \$25,000, which the Bemidji Career Academies and NTC Foundation planned to use to offer 25 Bemidji High School students with scholarships.

"The Northwest Technical College Foundation wants to provide

scholarships to the students who have interest in technical education," Ashley Johnson, executive director of the NTC Foundation, said in a release. "We want to retain our homegrown students and their talent to provide the next generation of the workforce for our community."

The 800 students currently enrolled in the Bemidji Career Academies can pursue various career pathways that help them transfer to NTC after graduation. These include Health Careers, Manufacturing, Automotive Technology, Construction Trades,

Child Care and Education and Business.

Established in 2017, a release said that the Academies, "are equipping students with the skills necessary to obtain high-skilled employment and career exploration. Students are able to assess their skills and talents for application in the workforce and build skills transferable to the workplace as they take courses specific to their chosen Academy."

Suspected meth, fentanyl seized in Cass Lake

CASS LAKE — A search warrant conducted in Cass Lake earlier this week resulted in the seizure of suspected drugs, a firearm and ammunition.

According to a release from the Leech Lake Tribal Police Department, on Nov. 16 the department began an investigation regarding overdoses in the area. With the help of community cooperation, a search warrant was executed in Cass Lake regarding illegal drugs.

The search warrant yielded a seizure of suspected methamphetamine, suspected fentanyl, a firearm and ammunition inside of a residence. Gregory John Smith, 39, was

arrested as a result of the search warrant and is being held at the Cass County Jail for one charge of being a felon ineligible to receive, ship or transport weapons or ammo, and a third-degree sale of narcotics charge.

According to the release, the Leech Lake Tribal Police Department will continue its proactive approach to protecting the community and seeks the public's help with obtaining information on crimes in the area.

Much work is needed to stabilize the budget

I would like to start my November column with a word of gratitude for the many community members who supported the Bemidji Area Schools operating referendum this fall.

I know that many people were disappointed that, for a second consecutive year, the majority of voters at the polls declined a levy increase that would have supported Bemidji Area Schools with necessary funding for the next 10 years. The large number of people who reached out to me through emails, texts and phone calls have reminded me that the vote was very close and that many people in our community still support our schools.

Unfortunately, district leaders must now determine where cuts will be needed to balance the budget, just as we did over several months this past year. The decisions will be difficult to make, but budget reductions will be a necessity again if the district is to stay out of a deficit

spending situation. Much work will be needed over the next four or five months to stabilize the budget.

Beginning in December, the board will direct district administration to make recommendations regarding cuts to staffing and programs. We will need to conduct analyses of the costs of programs as compared to their benefits. We will also need to hold difficult discussions and conversations about ways to cut additional costs in a budget that has already been slashed to the point that there are very few budget items left to eliminate.

We will need to examine policies such as our class size policy in light of the need to reduce the district's expenditure budget. We will examine bus routes and walk zones around our schools. In addition, we will examine administrative costs, building budgets, activities fees, and the affordability and viability of certain extra-curricular activities.

Decisions must be made in light of our shrinking revenue budget amid growing expenditures caused by underfunded mandates, state funding that does not keep up with

inflationary pressures and a referendum question that did not pass.

There is a lot of work to be done over the next four or five months.

While we are embroiled in budget and policy discussions, we will continue to work on keeping our students and employees safe during a time when Minnesota is leading the nation in increased cases of COVID-19 per capita. I have been concerned to see our local two-week rolling case numbers rising sharply again as cold weather comes to our area.

Despite these increasing numbers, we are keeping the virus at bay in our schools thanks to the many mitigation strategies we are employing every day.

Unlike many schools across the state, we have not needed to shift into distance learning mode due to outbreaks, because what we are doing with masks, social distancing, the cohorting of student groups and cleaning is working. Another strategy that is working is our work with COVID vaccination clinics. The school district coordinated with Sanford Health public health last week to support vaccination clinics for students.

In addition, ISD 31 is working with the Minnesota Department of Health and at the Bemidji Middle School on Saturday, Nov. 20. Parents may bring their children to the school anytime between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. to receive their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine. The second dose will be offered during a clinic at Bemidji Middle School on Saturday, Dec. 11.

These clinics for 5- to 11-year-old children are an important tool because this age group is currently the highest demographic of Minnesotans with COVID infections. Parents and guardians may use this link to make an appointment for the vaccine clinics: my.primary.health/r/bemidji-area-schools?registration_type=ages+5-11.

I am very proud of the efforts of Bemidji Area Schools to keep students in school and to keep our schools safe and healthy since the beginning of the pandemic. As I've said from the beginning, "What we are doing is working!"

It evidently started while the residents were outside, but it is thought to have been started by an overheated stove. None of the contents of the house were saved.

BHS yearbooks date back to 1912, give glimpses of student life over the years

Two projects currently in the planning stages at the Beltrami County Historical Society are turning to old Bemidji High School yearbooks for information.

We, Cecelia McKeig and Sue Bruns, are working on the history of Bemidji High School, and the BCHS is also preparing an exhibit on "Women in Winter Sports" to open this winter.

This story gives a preview of some of the information that has been unearthed so far for one or both of these projects.


First, there was The Chippewa

It was 110 years ago when students at Bemidji High School met to make plans for the very first BHS yearbook. On Oct. 26, 1911, The Bemidji Pioneer reported on the naming of the yearbook's editors: "At a meeting of the students interested in the publication of a high school annual held last night in the commerce room of the high school, ... officers were elected to take charge of such a publication," and the names of the first yearbook staff were listed.

Plans were made for "an elaborate" book, and on Nov. 7, 1912, the Pioneer reported that The Chippewa had been selected from several suggested names for the first-ever high school annual. The yearbook would be modeled after the University of Minnesota's Gopher and would include various illustrations and photos of all classes, students, faculty and organizations. The yearbook staff boasted that "the 1912 Chippewa will be the best book of its kind in Minnesota."

In April 1912, the book went off to press and in May, The Bemidji Pioneer reported that The Chippewa, described as "the first of the kind ever attempted in Bemidji" was "off the press and on sale." Its 10 segments included an overview of the school district and its facilities, high school faculty, classes and photos of students by class, with seniors first.

It also included the "Normal Department," illustrations and embellishments, and literature written by the students "ranging from sonnets and essays to stories, ...

orations,... (and) editorials." In addition, there were sections for music consisting of boys and girls glee clubs and orchestra; drama, including a cast picture of "Red Acre Farm" and a summary of the script; athletics including football, basketball, track and baseball — all boys only, and a section on the societies and organizations at BHS.

The tenth and final segment of the book — and one of its largest — was devoted to the advertisers who supported the publication.

The text was written and supplied by students, and local photographer Nels Hakkerup contributed the pictures. The Pioneer did the printing and binding. Copies were available for sale for just \$1 at the Armory, at the Pioneer office, and at Netzer's Drug Store.

Only 260 copies were printed, and in the May 31, 1912, edition of the Pioneer reported that "of this number over half were sold before the book was off the press."

A copy of The Chippewa at the Beltrami County History Center gives the viewer a glimpse of high school life in Bemidji in 1911-1912. One page has an early school song that focuses less on sports than today's fight songs and more on overall school life but reveals the school colors of blue and white.

A note from the editors expressed their pride in this accomplishment of the first-ever Bemidji High School annual with hopes for many more yearbooks to follow. Fundraising was begun in the fall of 1912 for the second annual, but if a 1913 BHS annual followed, the Beltrami County Historical Society has no evidence of it.

The Meddler and Coniferales

No mention of other annual publications has been found until 1919, when a yearbook titled The Meddler was for sale, apparently in a similar format to The Chippewa, but one new addition in the sports section was a girls' basketball team. A Pioneer story in October 1920 has the next mention of planning for a new high school yearbook in Bemidji, but no information about a new publication for sale appears until 1922.

The BCHS collection contains a copy of that 100-year-old high school yearbook — similar in content to the 1912 and 1919 annuals with sections on faculty, sports, activities and samples of writing from BHS students.

The name of the 1921-22 annual was The Coniferales. The Pioneer noted its unusual title and, in a short piece in the April 19, 1922, paper defined the term — with the help of Webster's Dictionary — as "an order of gymnospermous trees and shrubs," and expressed a lack of admiration for the students having selected the title.


Women's sports

Without a copy of The Meddler in the historical society's possession, The Coniferales is BCHS's earliest high school publication to include a photo of the 1921-22 BHS girls basketball team.

The next BHS annual in the BCHS archives is The Bemidji Chief from 1934. By then, girls basketball no longer existed, except in intramural clubs like the G.A.A. (Girls' Athletic Association) or the G.R.A. (Girls' Recreational

Association).

In the 1940s, the BHS annual's title became Lumberjack. Through the 1940s, 1950s, 1960s

and into the early 1970s, the girls were mainly relegated to cheerleading for the boys' sports that continued to expand

and grow in popularity.

Throughout the 1940s and 1950s, the status of curling as a sport in yearbooks is unclear with group photos appearing as either a club (including both boys and girls) or a "minor sport" (boys only). In 1956, the "curling team" was included in the sports section with a photo including both boys and girls, but in 1959, the curling photo included only males.

Finally, after the Title IX law was passed in 1972, the sports section of the 1973 BHS Lumberjack included a picture of the girls track team, swim team, and synchronized swimming.

The DOE awarded \$200 million to organizations across the U.S. basing their award amounts on project feasibility, positive impact and other factors. Native Sun received the largest award according to a press conference with DOE Secretary Jennifer Granholm and Vice President Kamala Harris.

Expected to commence in early 2022 and taking place over a three-year funding period, the project will add EV charging stations on frequently traveled routes from the Red Lake and Standing Rock Nations to critical destinations and along the Native American Scenic Byway as a resource for those in the upper Midwest region, a release said.

The installation of these stations will be facilitated with the help of project partners including the Standing Rock Renewable Energy Power Authority, Red Lake Fishery, American Lung Association, Xcel Energy, Otter Tail Power and Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, among several others.

These partners will install 59 fast-charging hubs and 63 level two electric vehicle charging stations. Additional education and outreach engagement at 52 events throughout three years will aim to reach more than 10,000 attendees to support broader access to EVs.

"Expanding access to electrified transportation will help ensure that everyone will benefit as cleaner vehicles become more widely available," Jon Hunter, Senior Director of Clean Air at the American Lung Association, said in a release. "We are eager to work with all the project partners to demonstrate the benefits that electric vehicles will have in these communities."

Blake added that, "each organization brings a specific expertise to the table. When thinking about putting together a charging network, it seems it's a great idea. But how do we implement it? That's when we bring in some experts."

The project will also deploy 19 new EVs and related equipment by tribal governments, utilities, schools and businesses.

astronomically since 2011 and that charging networks are being planned for across the U.S.

Regarding the future of fossil fuels, Blake emphasized Indigenous resistance to the fossil fuel industry as was seen during various pipeline construction protests. While he participated in these, he wanted to take even more action to give people more clean energy options.

"The thing about Native people is that we don't stop. I see this project as another way of resistance. We're not just sitting down saying 'OK, you won this round.' No, we're going to keep going a couple more rounds," he said with a chuckle.

This commitment is proven even more with potential plans to add a fleet of electric buses and other vehicles to Red Lake. Along with Standing Rock, Red Lake leaders will collaborate with project partners to evaluate each tribal nation's needs and develop a pathway toward 100% clean energy vehicle use, along with future infrastructure needs, by a target date.

Looking ahead to the expansion of clean vehicle use, job creation and economic development, Blake's passion and excitement for the upcoming three-year development does not come up short.

"We will fight for all our children and grandchildren's future," Blake said in a release. "Big oil is going to build pipelines, a thing of the past. We are going to build the future with an EV charging network and will continue to fight for Mother Nature and the sacred."

them, will likely become effective eventually.

As of Tuesday, Nov. 16, 215 county employees, about 50% of the government unit's workforce, had been vaccinated. With the ETS, the county would be required to determine vaccination status, obtain proof of vaccinations, maintain records of vaccination status, ensure weekly COVID tests and enforce face mask wearing.

After the presentation, Barry said staff will continue monitoring the situation, research methods, begin writing policy documents and bring their findings back to the board in the near future.

"I resent the fact that they're giving us just the amount of decision making where it's going to make us the bad guys," District 2 Commissioner Reed Olson said. "I don't like that they're having us decide and basically split hairs, figuring out how to pay for their mandate."

we'll lose a bunch of employees, and if we go another way, it'll look like we don't care," Lucachick said. "Our statistics show that nearly half our employees have said, 'nope, don't want to get a needle.' I'm hoping the courts do what they did on another major issue we've had. We had another contentious issue in this county, and an injunction was placed on it and it's still holding."

Lucachick was referring to a split vote by the board opting out of the United States Refugee Resettlement Program. The decision was nullified when the ability of individual counties to opt out of the program, created by former President Donald Trump, was

halted in court.

"This is a fight I'm not looking to have with our community," Olson said. "I do wish our vaccination rates were higher, but I'm not interested in having a big community argument where we're not going to change anyone's minds."

"I also don't like the fact that the cost of implementing this also falls on the county. We have the American Rescue Plan dollars, but that's not what we're looking at spending that on. That would take away from investments we're looking to make in other areas of county government."

they care so much about rescuing exploited children."

Having Luna at the Bemidji office every day, Evans said, provides some much needed emotional relief to agents who work on these tough cases.

"She started as a service dog, and now she's doing K9 work for us. In many ways, she's a service dog for our staff who get to see and interact with her every day," he added. "She's really a great, fun-loving dog."

Showing off her skills

For Luna's handler, BCA Special Agent William Bennett, it's not his first rodeo.

"When I was a deputy (sheriff), I had a German Shepherd K9," Bennett said. "They opened this position up to whoever wanted to do it, and I had some K9 experience in the past."

Luna has worked on about 19 search warrants since she joined the BCA Investigations team, typically assisting local agencies.

"We basically work on predatory crimes, child pornography, downloading images, that kind of stuff is what we're looking for specifically," Bennett said.

In cases of that nature, police or investigators might not be able to find important pieces of evidence such as tiny SD cards or well-hidden cell phones – that's where K9 Luna comes in.

"Usually we'll go into search warrants and do the initial sweep, get the items that we see out in the open," Bennett explained. "Then we'll bring her in to do the fine-tuning stuff like closets and underneath the beds."

Luna is trained daily through food drive, meaning she needs to locate devices before she eats. Bennett typically hides three or four devices twice a day so

she can get fed.

"She's imprinted on the TPPO chemical," Bennett said. "When she finds that chemical, she thinks she's finding her food."

During a demonstration at BCA's Bemidji Regional Office, Bennett led Luna around a room to show how she can locate an SD card taped to the underside of a table.

"She searches with my hand, so I'll point in an area for her to search and she'll sniff that area," Bennett said, leading Luna through the room. "If she smells the chemical, she'll sit."

As Luna began sniffing the table with the hidden SD card, she quickly sat down.

"Now she's locked on it," Bennett said as Luna sat attentively. "I can walk around the room and do whatever I want to do, but she's not going to move because she smelled the chemical now."

After receiving a "show me" command from Bennett, Luna jumped up, putting her front paws on top of the table to signify that she had located the card, and she was then rewarded with a handful of food for a job well done.

'Driven to work'

Luna was originally working toward becoming a service dog

through the Michigan-based Paws with a Cause program. However, she failed out of the program after a year and a half.

Evans said that dogs who fail out of this service dog program can sometimes find success in being trained as K9s.

"Oftentimes they get these dogs that are maybe a little too rambunctious or don't have quite the demeanor to be able to be a service dog, but they're perfect for the type of work that we do," Evans explained.

To Jill Oliveira, public information officer for the BCA, K9 Luna never really failed as a service dog – she just expanded her client base.

"For both Sota and Luna, they were training to be service dogs where they would provide a

service to one person, and that didn't work out for either one of them," Oliveira said with a laugh. "They both flunked out of service school."

Luna and Sota were a great fit for becoming K9s because they enjoyed working and already knew many of the basic commands from their time training for Paws with a Cause.

"These dogs are often driven to work. . . It fits in perfectly for what we do," Evans said. "(Luna is) the second dog that we received through a grant program, at no cost to the taxpayers of Minnesota."

Although Luna and Sota didn't become service dogs, Oliveira believes that, as K9s with the BCA, they're able to help with

investigations that benefit the community on a larger scale.

"Now, they're serving the people of Minnesota by doing this work," Oliveira said. "So they're really continuing to be service dogs, only now they're serving the whole state."

CHARTING NEW TERRITORY

Bemidji State has revenge, history up for grabs in NCAA opener

Lake Bemidji has watched a lot of football over the years.

It has witnessed both glory days and decades of drought. It overlooked conference champions, record breakers and future NFL athletes growing up along its shores.

But Lake Bemidji has never watched a BSU football team worthy of the NCAA Tournament. Until this year.

“Obviously we’re thankful to the Lord for being here,” senior linebacker Jaylen Jenkins said. “... It’s never been done before. It’s amazing that we’re the first team to be able to do that.”

Ever since the program began in 1926 — when R. E. Mendenhall coached Bemidji State Teachers College to a 1-2-1 record while playing an all-high school schedule — there has never been a group to reach this stage. Especially once the strength of schedule improved.

“We’re playing football, and that’s the most important part of it right now,” BSU head coach Brent Bolte said. “But for the time being, we’re greedy. We want to keep playing, and we’re not just happy to be here. We want to

go make a run in the playoffs.”

Yet, for as loyal as its been all these years, Lake Bemidji also missed out on its biggest spotlight of the season. The lake has welcomed in 20 teams for a celebratory homecoming swim, but Augustana denied the Beavers a reunion this fall.

The stars, and brackets, have aligned just right for revenge.

“They ruined our homecoming, and they kept me from jumping in that lake,” junior defensive end Zollie Kaplan said. “We definitely want revenge. We’re ready to go end their season this week.”

The motivation is two-fold this time around. Revenge is an easy motivator, but a win would further solidify this season within the same legendary class as Paul Bunyan himself.

“They know what they’re going to get,” Jenkins said. “They’re going to get a hard-

Vaisanen adjusting to college game in first year

BEMIDJI — Bemidji, Minn., is a long way from Espoo, Finland.


It’s a little closer to Amarillo, Texas. That’s where Bemidji State men’s hockey freshman forward Jere Vaisanen was prior to joining the Beavers as a member of their 2021 signing class.

Vaisanen, who originally hails from Espoo, competed in the NAHL with the Amarillo Bulls before opting to attend BSU. But it’s a different type of hockey at the college level, something he’s learned 10 games into his freshman season.

“It’s a bit of a different game than juniors or back home in Europe,” Vaisanen said. “So I think it took a while. I think I’m finally starting to get used to it. And I think that showed on Saturday night.”

Vaisanen scored the first two goals of his career last Saturday to help Bemidji State sweep Lake Superior State and improve to 6-4 (5-1 CCHA). The two wins gave the Beavers their first winning record of the year, a tally more in line with the quality of play they feel they’ve been exhibiting all season.

The Finnish freshman has been one of a number of first-year players that have contributed for BSU this season. The list also includes goaltender Mattias Sholl, defenseman Tony Follmer, and fellow European forward

It’s always a balance of relying on experience and giving young players opportunities when figuring out four lines and defenseman pairings, especially when a team has as many experienced contributors as Bemidji State does. Head coach Tom Serratore doesn’t overthink it, though, preferring to let things work themselves out in practices and games.

“You just got to let them play,” Serratore said. “I mean, there’s no exact science to this stuff. You’re playing guys, you’re playing four lines, and when they get their opportunity, make the most of it.”

“And I think that’s what Jere Vaisanen did. I mean, he was opportunistic. They created chances for themselves with some hard work, and he finished (them). And that’s what you got

to do.”

From a player’s perspective, junior defenseman Kyle Looft has seen the younger players grow into their roles as the season has progressed.

“Any time you can get young guys to contribute, it’s huge,” Looft said. “So they’ve done a good job, they’re learning. Our leadership group has done a great job of preparing them, our coaching staff has, and they’ve come and worked.”

Having younger players in key roles can boost the confidence of the team overall, as the veteran players have depth to lean on and more quality players to help them win games.

“Young guys can produce too,” Serratore said. “I mean, we got a lot of good hockey players. Everybody’s got good hockey players, and sometimes it just takes

guys a while, because it’s a big step from junior hockey to college hockey.”

It’s a transition that took Vaisanen some time, but now he’s comfortable — and contributing.

“I think it’s a completely different game,” Vaisanen said. “So it’s pretty hard, but I mean, you get used to it. Takes a little time. But I don’t think all European players can play up here. It’s so different. But just with good coaching, you got to change the way you play a little bit, but (you can) make it work.”

The Beavers faced off against Michigan Tech on Friday, Nov. 19, with results coming after press time, and do so again at 6:07 p.m. tonight, Nov. 20, at the Sanford Center.

Beavers prevail in PKs, advance in NCAA Tournament

EMPORIA, Kan. — Everybody went right.

There was no complex game plan for the Bemidji State women’s soccer team on Friday. But, sometimes, less is more.

“No, that was not the plan. They just prefer their penalty kicks to the right,” BSU head coach Jim Stone said. “I was just trusting God — one way or another — win, lose or draw.”

With a 5-3 victory in PKs — the program’s first-ever shootout win — the Beavers prevailed over Central Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Emporia, Kan.

Following a scoreless regulation and 20 minutes of overtime, the entire Bemidji State shootout delegation fired right. And all five scored, locking up the second NCAA Tournament victory in program history.

“It’s an incredible feeling,” Stone said. “When you (reach the NCAAs) and you’re one and done, it’s painful. It hurts. So we’re excited that we get another opportunity to play on Sunday.”

Emma Huelsnitz had the decisive blow in the fifth round, a carbon copy of Erin Becker, Sara Wendt, Allyson Smith and Halle Peterson’s strong kicks that rocketed into the right side.

Alyssa Stumbaugh’s fourth-round save on a

hard UCO shot to the left opened the door for Huelsnitz’s pivotal moment.

“That was super big because it also gave me confidence to put one away and win the game,” Huelsnitz said. “After I made it, I was just thrilled. Felt like I was going to throw up because I was so happy.”

For Stumbaugh, there were certainly some nerves that accompanied such a high-stakes shootout, especially as the last line of defense for her team. But she said they weren’t nearly as bad as they could have been had she not been properly prepared.

“It was sort of nerve-wracking, but if I’m being honest, God was preparing my heart for it,” she said. “He had me watching professional PKs last night, (looking at) technique and everything. ... It wasn’t as nerve-wracking as if it was a surprise. He had already been preparing me.”

To reach the euphoric moment, Bemidji State (19-1-2) had to endure 25 mph winds and a Bronchos attack that generated eight corner kicks within the first 30 minutes.

Bachmann hits 1,000 points in BSU's blowout win

BEMIDJI — There was no mystery as to who was getting the ball to open the second quarter on Tuesday.

Brooklyn Bachmann, a fifth-year senior on the Bemidji State women's basketball team, sat at 998 career points in the huddle. So Bachmann came out, won positioning in the post, and scored on a move you can tell she's practiced a thousand times.

"It was an intentional play to get her an iso inside. She made it look easy," head coach Chelsea DeVille said. "It was a great opportunity out of that timeout to really let her shine. That was fun."

With a smooth finish on the right block, Bachmann became the 21st member of the program's 1,000 Point Club and the first addition since 2017.

But more than two points during a 79-46 win over Mayville State inside the BSU Gymnasium, Bachmann's score was a celebration of her efforts for a program that rebuilt through her and around her.

"It's incredible how far we've come," Bachmann said. "Props to DeVille. She recruited good class after good class. (Credit to) everyone for staying and committing to it. ...

It's so nice to see the fruit finally come into play."

Bachmann's role on the court is far different than it used to be. As a freshman, she was the

go-to option by default on a team that didn't often threaten elsewhere. Four years later, she's one cog in a wheel that has weapons all around.

Bachmann hardly even knew she was as close to the milestone as she was, but once she found out, she never stopped hearing about it.

"I knew I was probably close, but I wasn't even thinking about it until (Rachael Heittola) pointed it out," Bachmann said. "Rachael is like the stat queen. ... I knew at that point only because I was told by my teammates like 10,000 times."

As for the scoreboard, there wasn't much drama once Bachmann's bucket sparked a 15-0 run. The lead for the Beavers (2-0) was just 16-10 after one, but it quickly leapt to 31-16 behind back-to-back 3-pointers from senior Claire Wolhowe and five quick points out of redshirt freshman Jana Swanson.

Rumer Flatness even got in on the action, rattling in a three for her first career points at BSU three years after climb-

ing to No. 2 all-time in the Bemidji High School scoring ranks.

The difference stood at 46-25 by halftime, but the margin still had another growth spurt upcoming. The Beavers only allowed five points in the third quarter, leaning on a defensive surge to pull ahead 61-30.

The team spread the wealth in the fourth quarter, rotating in a myriad of bench players and racking up 13 different scorers by game's end. On a night that belonged to Bachmann, everybody got involved.

"To see where we've come from my freshman year to what we're doing now — how everyone got minutes and how everyone's scoring — it's really cool," Bachmann said. "(This milestone) is a big accomplishment for all of us."

Megan French stepped up for a penalty kick for BSU in the 44th minute, but she went for the bottom left corner and Central Oklahoma keeper Kaitlyn Asher made the stop to preserve the 0-0 stalemate.

The Beavers played with the wind at their backs in the second half and saw the attack come to life even more, but the

scoreboard still didn't budge.

"I think the conditions of the field and the winds both played into that, to be honest," Stone said. "I feel blessed and happy to be on the right side of it because I've been on the other side many, many times."

Stumbaugh finished with five saves, but none were bigger than her momentum-seizing stop in the fourth round of PKs.

"The girls were relying on me to do my job, and God really blessed me with the opportunity to do it," she said. "I knew my girls were going to make it

into the net, so I just needed to get one save."

Then Huelsnitz found herself in the biggest spot of her young career.

"It's funny because as a freshman, I was really scared going into it," Huelsnitz said. "But all the girls calmed each other down. We knew we had to put them all away, and we did."

The win vaults Bemidji State into the second round, where BSU will face the winner of Emporia State and Northwest Missouri State at 2 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 21, in Emporia.

"I'm not ready to be done playing with these seniors," Stumbaugh said. "They're an amazing group of girls. They're amazing players. I want to end on a win for them."

Former opponent Bianco leads Beavers to opening win



BEMIDJI — The last time Travis Bianco played in a game featuring the Bemidji State men's basketball team, he was behind enemy lines.

Two years later, he's sporting the Beavers' green and white as one of the team's most promising transfers.

"I remember a lot of that game. Absolutely," Bianco said. "It's definitely interesting (landing in Bemidji). It's weird. ... They recruited me after last year, and I just felt like it was meant to be."

Bianco spent four years with palm trees and beaches at Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Fla., a team that hosted BSU for a Thanksgiving

invite in 2019. Fast forward to Tuesday, when Bianco helped fuel Bemidji State to an 82-67 nonconference win over Concordia-St. Paul in a feel-good season opener.

"He made an impression on us," head coach Mike Boschee said of the 2019 meeting. "We liked how he played, and it was a good fit. He's getting out of Florida for one

year, experiencing Minnesota snow, and I think he's excited about it."

After transferring from Eckerd to Valdosta State for 2020-21, Bianco found his way to Bemidji for his final collegiate season. And just when the Beavers needed their newcomer, Bianco was ready to answer the call.

With momentum swinging and a 14-point lead down to as few as four, Bianco brought the BSU Gymnasium to a deafening roar. He lobbed a ball to a soaring Mohamed Kone in transition, a perfect feed that Kone slammed home.

"That play was a momentum-changer," Bianco said. "... It ended up being an electric play."

The textbook alley-oop was a dunk worth well

more than two points, as it stole back the momentum that guided Bemidji State (1-0) to the finish line.

"That play exemplified what I'm looking for with this group: an attacking, aggressive style," Boschee said. "(We want) to make the rims black and blue this year."

The Golden Bears (1-2) made a run in the second half, closing within 47-43 with 15 minutes to play. But the Kone dunk restored a double-digit advantage at 53-43 two minutes later, and the difference never fell back under nine.

Yet Bianco wasn't the only newcomer who impressed on Tuesday. Minnesota Duluth transfer John Sutherland put up a game-high 18 points on 7-for-10 shooting,

while Dakota State transplant Gare Ewefada posted 11 points off the bench.

"The new guys are talented. They'll help us," Boschee said. "To have other guys being able to step up and complete our team, so we're not one-dimensional, is exciting to see."

Bianco finished with 17 points, 11 rebounds, four assists and three steals. Kone also hit double figures with 17 points of his own.

Bischoff buries BHS with 6 scores in Jacks' home debut

BEMIDJI — The Bemidji High School girls hockey team experienced a rude return to home ice Tuesday night. No sooner had the first 30 seconds of the game elapsed than the Lumberjacks found themselves in a 1-0 hole.

The scorer was Grand Rapids/Greenway freshman Mercury Bischoff. She'd go on to score five more, doing most of the work to bury BHS 9-0 in the Jacks' season debut at Bemidji Community Arena.

"I was a bit surprised," head coach Mike Johnson said. "I just felt like we were not prepared to match their intensity."

Bemidji also dropped a road matchup with Thief River Falls 3-0 on Thursday in TRF.

The Lightning struck from the jump Tuesday, netting four goals in the first period and adding three more in the second to generate an insurmountable advantage. By the third period, the clock was continuously run-

ning, and the Jacks were out of time.

"I don't think we were quite ready," Johnson said. "We had a game against East Grand Forks on Saturday. Things went pretty well, and kind of according to plan in some ways. We ended up losing, but it was a real good battle and pretty even matchup."

"And I was expecting something maybe similar tonight, and right from the opening drop of the puck, I think they were beating us to loose pucks and winning the battles. ... It was a good eye-opener for us in the long run."

Bemidji generated 16 shots on goal against GRG goaltender McKenzie Cole, but each of them was saved. It would have been purely academic to score in this game, as Bischoff was not going to be stopped.

"She was one of the top scorers for Grand Rapids as a seventh grader," Johnson said. "And then she's got good bloodlines. And so we knew who she was, and how she plays."

Sophomore Payton Weidemann started in net for the Lumberjacks and drew the unenviable task of slowing down Bischoff and the rest of the Lightning's electric offense. Weidemann stopped 24 GRG shots but conceded seven goals.

The overall result was a disappointing one for BHS. But it's still very early in the season, and much can be gained from facing a team — and a player — of this caliber.

The Jacks return to the rink against Roseau at 7:15 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 23, at Bemidji Community Arena.

City, Northern Township officials hold joint meeting

BEMIDJI — The extension of city water services and how it comes into play with annexation was a hot topic during a joint meeting between Bemidji and Northern Township officials.

The meeting, held Tuesday evening, included a lengthy discussion regarding public and private water systems, with an emphasis on those around Lake Bemidji. Before the conversation was underway on the subject, the officials were informed about the situation up to this point.

According to the presentation, on the east side of Lake Bemidji, there are several older systems, as well as some with no data. The presentation noted that potentially 60% are not compliant. The presentation also touched on Ruttger's Birchmont Lodge, which has until next November to have a plan in place for coming into compliance with water/sewer guidelines. Earlier this year, Ruttger's requested a connection to the city's water system.

However, there are other township properties between the resort and the city lim-

its which could be impacted. During the meeting, Northern Township Board Member Michael Kelly said constituents drew a hard line against annexation.

"We met with our residents in our public meeting in early November," Kelly said. "They made it perfectly clear they're not interested in annexation. What they also made clear to us is that they want Northern Township to move in a direction where either we cooperate with the city to get municipal services, which seem to be available, or we go our own way."

"One thing I keep coming back to is, whether it's a district that involves both the city and the township, or a memorandum of understanding to extend services, it's loud and clear that it can't be at the expense of any landmass from Northern Township."

Over the last decades, three sections of Northern Township were brought within the city limits, based on an orderly annexation agreement approved in 2004. The agreement brought the three sections in with three phases. The first phase, in 2010, brought in land between Rob-

ertson Drive NW and Norwood Drive NE, bordered by Lake Bemidji to the east and Irvine Avenue to the west. The second phase, in 2015, included property along Birchmont Drive and Bemidji Avenue, also bordered by Lake Bemidji and Irvine Avenue to the east and west, and up north to Elm Street NE.

The final phase, in 2020, extended the city northward from Anne Street up to Lakewood Drive, and westward to U.S. Highway 71 and the Bemidji Regional Airport. The annexation brought in more than 500 residents to the city's population.

In his response to Kelly, Bemidji City Manager Nate Mathews said a district to share services is likely off the table, at least for the near future.

"I do think districts have a lot of merit in communities, but it does take a long time to create and an act of the Minnesota Legislature is needed," Mathews said. "From my perception, it feels like we lost that opportunity to create a district because Ruttger's needs to have a plan in place."

"We have a six-month window here to decide what

the solution is," Mathews said. "Because, if we take a look at when things need to be constructed and built, the design work (for Ruttger's) would have to happen next year. It's a really compressed timeline."

"We need to know what will happen to Ruttger's and that's what will need to be focused on now, and perhaps, in future meetings," Bemidji Public Works Director Craig Gray said. "If we don't decide to put a pipe there, we need to notify them of that so they can start working on a private system. That's what, as staff, you guys really need to bear down on."

According to Gray, the council did pass a motion that would allow Ruttger's to be annexed and connected to the city's water system, without other residents along the path having to be brought into the city.

Officials from both government units noted how more discussion is needed to come to the best solution for the Ruttger's situation. They also agreed on coming to a solution to ensure Lake Bemidji's water quality.

The quality of the lake was brought up after Gray noted

how phosphorus levels have been rising.

"In terms of water quality, when we did the phosphorus prevention ditch project on Lake Irving, they looked at the quality of Lake Bemidji," Gray said. "Lake Irving is classified as an impaired water for phosphorous and Lake Bemidji is right on the edge and it may not be long until it's an impaired water."

"Anything is possible if we stop, go back and get a committee together with all of the players," Kelly said. "This is an opportunity I do want to see happen, but I also can't go against what our residents want."

"I ask myself as a new mayor and member of the city council, how important as a community have we deemed this," said Mayor Jorge Prince. "To me, if we see this as a crisis, as something that needs to be solved, then we'll sit down and work things out. But I think we'll have to be willing to be a little flexible, knowing that Lake Bemidji is ultimately a pristine asset of our entire community, and we need to do what we can to protect it."

Concertmaster

Johnson reflects on legacy as his 80th act approaches

The concert was starting, but the headliner was still on an airplane heading for the Bemidji airport.

The John Glas Fieldhouse was filled to capacity with country music fans waiting for Johnny Cash to Walk the Line. The concert promoter was nervous as the Carter Family was wrapping up its set as the opener to the legendary Man in Black.

"Here's how nerve-wracking it can be," explained Ron Johnson, who has promoted dozens of concerts here since 1982. "The Johnny Cash concert is starting in Bemidji, and Johnny's not even in the state. He's still flying in. I'm just a nervous wreck."

Johnson, who has served on the Bemidji City Council since 2000, is also the Design/Promotion Manager for Lakeland PBS television. He has produced 47 concerts on behalf of the station and another 32 on his own through his North Country Concerts enterprise. Johnson's 80th concert will be on Tuesday, Nov. 23, when Mannheim Steamroller performs at the Sanford Center.

He can share plenty of interesting stories, including the one about Johnny Cash and the concert that was literally up in the air.

The year was 1986. Cash was supposed to do a Bemidji concert two years earlier, but he canceled and Johnson had to scramble for a replacement. He was able to sign T.G. Sheppard and "Whispering" Bill Anderson.

The next year, promoter Hap Peebles called Johnson. "Hap said Johnny felt bad about not honoring that (earlier commitment), and so he's going to come to town," Johnson recounted. "This is like getting Garth Brooks now. I mean (Cash) probably still would be as big a concert as you could get if he





was alive right now. But back then that was a big name, and he was coming to Bemidji."

Johnson booked the concert in late fall 1985 and came up with a promotion: "Let's give Cash for Christmas."

"I sold a ton of presale, so before we went public I was already in the black," said Johnson, who had started doing

his own shows the year before. "Sold the place out, I think 3,300 seats."

Then about three weeks before the concert date, Cash's manager called and asked if they could change the date. It seems Johnny was booked to perform out East at a Billy Graham Crusade and would have trouble getting to Bemidji on time.

"I told him there's a clause in the contract and you can buy it out," Johnson said. "But I would have lost a lot of money. I was adamant about it. Finally, I went to Hap and said, 'You figure it out.' because I bought the act through him. It was lined up to be Johnny Cash and June Carter. So he said, 'I'm going to send up the Carter Family with his band and they're going to do an opening set, so that will buy me some time.'"

While the Carters were on stage, Johnson was summoned to the box office to deal with an issue. Still unsure of Cash's arrival, he headed back down to the main arena as the Carters were wrapping up.

"And then a guy touched me on the shoulder," Johnson said. "It was Johnny Cash. He had arrived while I was upstairs. And he goes, 'Look at that crowd. I would never let that

promoter's nerves. When Loretta Lynn came here in 1987, her megahit "Coal Miner's Daughter" had just come out. When Sawyer Brown and Billy Dean played in the old Bemidji High School auditorium in 1992, they had the No. 1 and 3 country hits that week: Sawyer Brown's "Some Girls Do" and Dean's "If There Hadn't Been You."

The late Michael Johnson was booked

10 times and Johnson brought the Statler Brothers to town three times.

From that first concert in 1982 featuring Mel Tillis through Tuesday's Mannheim Steamroller performance, Ron Johnson has built quite a legacy.

Even the one concert that was up in the air.

"Schindler's List"

Fly fishing doubled in size after the movie was released. Brad Pitt was outstanding and the narrator, Robert Redford, helped make the movie special.

riders, and 150 extras, and took three weeks to film at the Triple U Buffalo Ranch outside Fort Pierre, S.D. Kevin Costner, who did most of his own horseback riding, nearly broke his back in a fall. "Dances With Wolves" was the first Western to win Best Picture since Cimarron (1931). Costner won the Oscar for Best Director and grossed over 40 million alone on this now classic film.

"The Godfather"

For the filming of the movie, star Marlon Brando, had a dentist make him a custom mouthpiece to create his "bulldog" sagging jowls look. Al Pacino, as Michael Corleone, didn't really want to play the role. In the scene that featured a horse's head in bed, a fake horse head was used in rehearsals, but when the cameras were actually rolling, director Francis Ford Coppola used the real thing. The words "mob" and "mafia" are not used in the movie. Godfather I, II and III are arguably the best gangster movies ever made.

"American Graffiti"

I am a product of the 50s so I can't leave out "American Graffiti." Directed by George Lucas (he also directed Star Wars), there is no connection between the TV series, "Happy Days," and the movie, "American Graffiti." The soundtrack sold three million copies. Actually, the film is more about life in the early 60s. That's OK, I was around then, too, and I still like to rock around the clock—well, not really.

Benedict J. Rucinski (Ben), 82, of Becida, MN, died peacefully in his sleep, Monday, November 8, 2021 in Blackduck, MN. Funeral services were November 13, 2021 at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Wilton, MN. Interment was at Sacred Heart Catholic Cemetery. Dad was born July 13, 1939 on the family farm in Becida, MN. He attended Sunny Hill Grade School in Fern Township through 8th grade and was the first to graduate in his family from Bemidji High School in 1957. He lived and worked on the farm, milking and logging until he was drafted into the US Army April 15, 1963. He completed basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. After being discharged from the military, dad returned home to work on the farm with his brother Junior and cared for his parents until their deaths. Dad married Lois (Stotts) in May of 1977 and together they raised 4 children.

In 1992, Dad suffered a major heart attack and had to make a life-changing decision to sell his cows and give up dairy farming. He continued to log and decided to follow his passion of care giving, taking classes to become a Home Health Aid. He worked at Beltrami County Health and Human Services for the next 22 years, often caring for clients much younger than himself. He thoroughly enjoyed caring for the homebound, but enjoyed visiting and teasing the office ladies just as much, both for their company and the treats they would bring in.

After retiring from the County, he continued to log with just his chainsaw and John Deere A until he was 79 years old. He cared full-time for Junior until his death in 2017. He was a lifelong member of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Wilton, serving on the Council for many years, Eucharistic Minister and a Confirmation teacher. 

ST PAUL — The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources invites Minnesotans interested in serving on the department's Aquatic Invasive Species Advisory Committee to apply by 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 15. Aquatic invasive species present one of the state's most pressing natural resource issues. Preventing the spread of zebra mussels, Eurasian watermilfoil, invasive carp, starry stone-wort and other invasive plants and animals is of critical environmental, recreational and economic importance, a release said.

The AIS Advisory Committee is a core element of the DNR's partnership approach to addressing aquatic invasive species. The committee comprises 15 members. The DNR is seeking five new members to join the committee, with term lengths of three years. The DNR established the advisory committee in 2013 to help guide the agency's AIS prevention and management activities. Members provide advice and diverse perspectives on programmatic direction, emerging research needs, communications and funding strategies. The committee meets eight times a year, either online or in a central Minnesota location, as determined by the DNR. The DNR seeks an inclusive and well-rounded advisory committee, encompassing differences including but not limited to race, ethnicity, nationality, religion,

socioeconomic status, education, marital status, language, age, gender, sexual orientation, mental or physical ability, life experience, ideas, knowledge and learning styles. Current members have a range of personal and professional experience with AIS issues, including prevention, decontamination, public awareness and control activities. The committee also reflects the range of private, non-profit and public sector organizations that are actively engaged in AIS issues. Appointees may request mileage reimbursement for in-person meetings, but members are not eligible for per diem. Members must abide by requirements pertaining to potential conflicts of interest. Advisory committee members can expect a commitment of six to 16 hours per month during their terms. **How to apply** The DNR is accepting applications online at dnr.state.mn.us/aisadvisory/index. Advisory committee data is classified as private under state law, except for what is specifically listed in the statute as public. Yellow is a common color for birds around the globe

Minnesota's species of birds, all 423 or so, come in all sorts of colors. And the color yellow shows up a great deal of the time. Wings, rumps, heads, eyes, bills, backs, breasts, bellies, and even feet and legs are splashed yellow on many species of birds.

Some birds have yellow as part of their common names that usually describe a specific body part. For example, common yellowthroat, yellow-headed blackbird, greater and lesser yellowlegs, yellow-billed loon, yellow-throated vireo, yellow warbler, yellow-rumped warbler, yellow-throated warbler and yellow-eyed junco.

And there's more. Yellow-billed magpie, yellow-crowned night heron, yellow-breasted chat, yellow-billed cuckoo, yellow wagtail, yellow-green warbler, and yellow-footed gull are species of birds that are colored yellow somewhere on their anatomy.

There are some "yellow" birds, however, that aren't very yellow at all. The "yellow" rail is a stretch, as is the "yellow" bellied sapsucker. On the other hand, there are some of our yellow avian friends

that should be named, in part, as such. Instead of American goldfinch, perhaps American yellow finch would be a better-suited name. Or, yellow-rumped tanager instead of western tanager; yellow-masked warbler for hooded warbler; and yellow-headed warbler in lieu of hermit warbler.

Yet, for all that yellow seen throughout the bird world, only a few can be called yellow because, well, they really are mostly yellow. Here in Minnesota, only two species come to mind: the American goldfinch and the yellow warbler. But even these two species of birds, though clearly yellow in color, are not completely yellow.

The American goldfinch is so named based upon the breeding plumage of the male bird. The females, juveniles, and non-breeding males are not very yellow at all. Even so, the bright yellow adult male goldfinch in full breeding plumage has a fair amount of black, too. Its forehead and much of its wings and tail are colored black.

Goldfinches are common visitors to backyard bird feeders. I find their docile manner and gregarious nature refreshing, not to mention the joy of observing the dazzling displays of bright yellows on our feeders.

Another yellow bird that might at times be mistakenly called a "yellow canary" is the yellow warbler. This

bird is our only "all-yellow" warbler. Both sexes, unlike American goldfinches, are colored mostly yellow, but the male yellow warbler has red streaks on its underparts and has an olive crown. Females, on the other hand, lack the distinctive reddish belly streaks.

Yellow warblers are insectivores and occupy a variety of habitats, but are typically observed around wetlands and dense deciduous woodlands near riparian areas. Males arrive in early

spring and begin establishing breeding territories by singing their wonderfully soft and melodious "Sweet, sweet, sweet, I'm so very sweet" song.

The color yellow also shows up in some species of woodpeckers, namely the northern flicker, sometimes called the yellow-shafted flicker, and the yellow-bellied woodpecker, although its yellowish belly isn't readily evident at first glance. And there are many other local birds with yellow in their plumage or other parts

of their anatomy. Yellow-colored legs, for example, occur in many species of water birds (think greater yellowlegs and lesser yellowlegs for example). And think of some birds' wings, breasts, rumps, heads and crowns, beaks and even eyes—yellow-rumped warbler, western meadowlarks and eastern meadowlarks, yellow-headed blackbird, yellow-billed magpie and the yellow eyes of great horned owls.

Indeed, yellow is

certainly a common color for birds around the globe. It is undeniably rampant amongst the many species of wood warblers. All the same, not all birds called yellow are yellow, not all yellow birds have yellow in their name, and not all yellow birds are canaries. Regardless, yellow or not, the many and varied avian colors are everywhere as we get out and enjoy the great outdoors.

The 'Power' of TV:

'Ghost' comes home to roost in season finale

The crime-drama series "Power Book II: Ghost" began its own seat-edge narrative just six months after the original series, "Power," wrapped up its sixth and final season in February 2020. Now at the end of its second season, the cast and crew are preparing to deliver an action-packed finale fans won't want to miss. "Power Book II: Ghost" Season 2 draws to a close on Sunday, Nov. 21, on Starz.

In a shocking, pseudo-Shakespearean move, fans looked on as Tariq (Michael Rainey Jr., "The Butler," 2013) killed his father, Ghost, in Season 1. As he dealt with the consequences of his actions, Monet (Mary J. Blige, "Mudbound," 2017), the Tejada family matriarch, was left to take the fall for Ghost's murder, and now she's without her trusted bodyguard, Owl (Preston Christopher Lawrence, "The Punisher").

Ever since the murder, Tariq has been battling haunting reflections of the father he killed, the mother he doomed and the life he chose.

So far, Tariq has struggled to save his family business. While trying to obey Monet's wishes and attend high school, the ruthless Tejada family's hold over the young man is strong, gunning for him to take control of the streets. If "Power Book II: Ghost" has taught audiences anything, it's that looks can be deceiving, and your biggest ally might just be your greatest enemy.

"Power" was created and produced by Courtney A. Kemp ("The

Good Wife") in collaboration with Curtis "50 Cent" Jackson ("Freelancers," 2012) and aired from 2014 to 2020. The series follows the story of James "Ghost" St. Patrick (Omari Hardwick, "For Colored Girls," 2010), who was an intelligent drug dealer trying to leave the criminal world behind to pursue a legitimate business as a nightclub owner. All the while, he evaded arrest and his crumbling family life.

Meanwhile, his son had plenty of other plans and problems stemming from his father's world. On top of that, Tariq deals with his own dilemmas, chief among which involves his love interest, Diana (LaToya Tonodeo, "The Oath," 2018), part of the Tejada family, with whom Tariq has a (quite literal) love-hate relationship.

Tariq transitions from a side character in "Power" to a morally grey anti-hero in "Power Book II." It's a role that, given Tariq's faces, needed an actor who could grasp the character's complex and conflicting emotions — something Rainey Jr. does with ease.

After freeing Monet from the death penalty and putting her into witness protection, Tariq faked his Uncle Tommy's (Joseph Sikora, "Shutter Island," 2010) death. Yes, Tommy is "dead," but he'll no doubt be back — he has a score to settle with the two of them, after all. To make matters more complicated, just because there's been an effort to save Monet doesn't mean there isn't bad blood between her and Tariq. The young man now appears rather stuck; he knows that making Monet disappear would be

an end to his grief, but he also feels a sense of duty toward her.

In "Power Book II," family is hardly family. It's a business. Tariq entered a world he's trying to get out of, not unlike his father, and in the meantime, he's become a businessman, a high-performing drug dealer and a killer (also rather like "Ghost"). But he's still just a kid.

Rainey Jr. also rose to fame as a kid. At 10 years old he starred in the Italian film "Un altro mondo" (2010), even learning to speak Italian for the role. Since then, he has worked alongside Hollywood household names Danny Glover ("The Drummer," 2020), Charles Dutton ("Carter High," 2015) and Nicholas Cage ("Pig," 2021), to name a few.

For those not caught up on the Power universe, the second installment, "Ghost," has also featured cameos from other strong and influential actors this season, from Daniel Sunjata ("Manifest") to Lovell Adams-Gray ("Christmas in the Rockies," 2020) and Melanie Liburd ("This Is Us"), among others.
