Auditor-treasurer residency issues resurface

Investigation reveals details about Inman's living situation

FOLEY – Benton County's auditor treasurer is in the spotlight once again regarding where she calls home.

Documents detailing an investigation of Nadean Inman's residency were included in the Benton County Board of Commissioners Feb. 15 meeting packet. Because one board member was absent at that meeting, commissioners tabled discussion until March 1.

Inman is the elected auditor-treasurer of Benton County. She has held the office by appointment since December 2017 and was elected to the office in November 2018.

According to packet documents, Inman is alleged to be living in Sherburne County.

Nohner accepts position with CentraCare

SRRHS principal's last day is April 15

SAUK RAPIDS – Sauk Rapids-Rice Public Schools announced a change to its administrative team this week.

Karl Nohner, principal at Sauk Rapids-Rice High School, will be leaving the district after taking a job with CentraCare Health. Nohner's last day will be April 15, and assistant principals Sandy Logrono and Steve Wagner will share the responsibilities of the role for the remainder of the school year as the district interviews for the position.

Nohner will be employed as a

workforce development program manager at CentraCare.

"Principal Nohner has demonstrated steadfast leadership as well as strong advocacy for academics and partnerships with students, families and staff throughout his tenure at Sauk Rapids-Rice Public Schools," said Superintendent Bradley D. Bergstrom in a release Feb. 22. "The district extends its sincere appreciation to Mr. Nohner for his dedicated service and wishes him and his family only the best in this future opportunity."

Nohner shared a personal video message with parents, students and staff Tuesday via the district's communications system, citing the need for more time with family as a reason for the resignation.

"I've had incredible joy and fulfillment

in my time here at Sauk Rapids-Rice High School," he said. ... "With that, I also look back at the things that are important to me, and one of the things that continues to emerge is trying to find as much time as possible with my family, especially having two young children of my own. As a result, although I have had so much excitement and joy in what I am doing here, I have

found myself in a position of needing to explore an alternate career path."

Nohner began his career at Sauk Rapids-Rice High School as a social studies teacher and athletic coach after graduating from St. John's University in 2009.
